PORTLAND, Ore. --- (ALMS)--- Two new stars have burst into view in the galaxy of American Legion pageantry with the crowning of new junior and senior drum and bugle corps champions during the Legion's 47th National Convention, Aug. 20-26, here. The top senior corps for 1965 is the Grey Knight Post Crusaders of Post 952, Monroe, N. Y.; the champion junior unit is the Royal Aires, sponsored by Post 96, Cicero, Ill.

An appreciative crowd of some 15,000 in Multnomah Stadium thrilled to the spectacle of the intensified competition which saw the Crusaders take the crown from the Hawthorne Caballeros, Post 199, Hawthorne, N. J., who had held the coveted title for seven consecutive years. The battle was a close one. The victor's margin was by only .08 point.

In the junior corps competition, the newcomer Royal Aires, displaying flawless control in dynamics and spectacular precision in marching and maneuvering, took the title from the defending champion, The Garfield Cadets, sponsored by Post 255, Garfield, N. J. The Royal Aires' success story was given further flavor by the handicap they faced by arriving after a 72-hour bus trip, just before the Sunday morning elimination preliminaries with no more time available than to get into uniform and into competition.

The victory of the junior drum and bugle corps from Illinois marked the first time since 1967 that the championship has gone to other than a New Jersey unit.

The enthusiastic crowd showed little favoritism toward any of the ten competing units, giving all contestants a hearty roar of approval as they painted a continuing series of geometric patterns in the brilliant colors of their uniforms and banners.

Hany a foot in the stadium audience was tapping to the syncopated rhythms of such popular favorites as "Birth of the Blues," "Yellow Bird," "Alexander's Ragtime Band," "Perfidia," "Poinciana," and several themes from "My Fair Lady."
