PORTLAND, ORE .-- (ALMS) -- The finest of American Legion sponsored Senior and Junior Drum and Bugle Corps will compete for the 1970 American Legion national championships in the Parade of Champions set for 7 p.m., Sunday, Aug. 30, in Portland Civic Stadium here.

A combination of 12 Senior and Junior Corps are scheduled to participate in the performance at the stadium as determined by preliminary competition on Sunday morning, and will compete for the national championships in their respective divisions in the Parade of Champions.

Always an American Legion National Convention highlight, the Parade of Champions produces one of the most stirring patriotic performances by precision marching and maneuvering musical units to be seen anywhere in the land.

Preliminary communications received by the Legion's Contest Coordinator indicate that most of the defending national champions in the several areas of competition will come to this Convention City to defend their crowns.

The Yankee Rebels, of Post 20, Baltimore, Md., are the defending American Legion National Championship Senior Corps, and the Cavaliers, of Post 985, Chicago, Ill., are the defending champion Junior Corps.

The Parade of Champions is the only event of The American Legion National Convention open to the general public for which there is an admission charge. Reserved seats for this thrilling performance are \$2.50 and general admission is \$2. On all orders received prior to Aug. 15, there will be a 50¢ discount. Checks should be made payable to The American Legion 1970 Mational Convention Corporation of Oregon, and directed to the Convention Corporation office at 1119 S.W. Park Ave., Portland, Ore. 97205.

Preliminary competition of Junior and Senior Drum and Bugle Corps events will be conducted at Marshall Eigh School, 3905 S.E. 91st Ave., with the Juniors Corps starting the program on Sunday morning and the Seniors scheduled immediately on completion of the Junior competition.

Conventioneers, guests and the general public are welcome to attend the preliminary events for which there is no admission charge.

Contest officials expect a large turnout of Junior Corps, particularly from the Morthwest, due to the Convention dates scheduled prior to the start of the school year.

The Seagrams Posts of The American Legion again will provide four new Ford automobiles which will be awarded to eligible members of The American Legion or the American Legion Auxiliary during the evenings proceedings.

All of the uniformed groups which compete in the Parade of Champions and other areas of convention competition such as preliminary contests, will participate in the giant American Legion National Convention parade on Monday, Aug. 31.

Contesting for American Legion National Championships in other areas of competition will be: Junior and Senior Color Guards, Junior and Senior Bands, Firing Squais, Motorcycle Drill Teams, and Choruses and Quartets.

PORTLAND, ORE. - (ALMS) -- Nrs. R. Michael Howard of Oklahoma City, Okla., who, as 17-year-old Patricia Ann Turner, won the 1962 American Legion's National High Echool Oratorical Contest, will make a return speaking engagement for the Legion.

Mrs. Howard will be a featured speaker before the Legion's National Americanism Commission sessions at 11 a.m., Saturday, Aug. 29, during the Legion's 52nd National Convention here.

While much of Mrs. Howard's time is taken up these days by her young son, Rick, born Oct. 8, 1968, she still manages to find time for a heavy schedule of civic activities.

She has just completed a year's term as president of Kappa Alpha Theta Junior Alumnas Group. She is a member of the Woman's Committee of the Oklahoma City Bymphony, Lyric Theatre Guild, Oklahoma City Panhellenic Council and the American Legion Auxiliary (in her hometown of Muskogee, Okla.).

The Howards, who are both graduates of the University of Oklahoma, hope to get their masters degree next year. Her husband, Mike, is an IBM marketing representative

After completing OU with a major in radio-television speech, Mrs. Howard worked for a brief time as operations manager with KWTV in Oklahoma City.

Mrs. Howard won the 1962 Oratorical events in Salt Lake City, Utah, and a \$4,000 college scholarship on the 17th anniversary of the loss of her father in Japan during World War II. Lt. Col. Doyne L. Turner, a B-29 squadron commander, died when his plane was shot down on a mission over Japan.

Mrs. Howard is one of only two girl winners in the 33 years the national contest has been held.
