# Ready Sunday Flag Day Show

The Seattle Police Drill Team, said to be the most traveled group of policemen in the United States, will be traveling to Chehalis this Sunday to display precision drill.

The show will be staged at the W. F. West athletic field at 2 p.m. The Chehalis post of the American Legion is sponsoring the exhibition in observance of Flag Day. There will be six other top marching bands, drum and bugle corps units and drill teams from throughout the state participating.

George Cobb, Legion commander, said the Seattle team is now celebrating its 26th anniversary. Each member is a regular police officer and drills for the most part on his own time, aside from his regular duties, and without additional pay.

The unit is a national champion. The drill team was originally formed as an official representative of the police department to welcome visiting dignitaries and march in local parades. The team has performed in every major West Coast city from Juneau,

Alaska, to Mexico, and west to Honolulu, Hawaii.

The policemen topped national championship honors as the top marching unit in the nation when it marched in the inauguration ceremonies for President Eisenhower in 1953. It also marched last January, for President Kennedy's inaugural.

"Red West", a member of the Olympia band and former "Sing-

ing State Patrolman," will sing The Star Spangled Banner.

Other marching units include: The Thunderbirds, University post Drum and Bugle Corps; Olympia post band; Women's Drill team, American Legion district 11; North Seattle post Junior Thunderbirds Drum and Bugle Corps, and several other bands.
