

# Portland Drum, Bugle Corps Winner in Salem Competition

Portland Hawks barely edged Salem's Flamingos to win A division honors Saturday night in the Opti-Rama drum and bugle corps competition at Salem Armory Auditorium.

The Hawks scored 77 points to 76.9 for the Flamingos. A dropped instrument and a flag penalty cost the Salem group the title.

Imperial Cadets, Portland, took third in A division.

The Titans of Bremerton, Wash., won B division honors, with the Pendleton Rangers second and the Spartans of Vancouver, Wash., third.

The C division title went to the Patriots of Spokane, with the Drifters from Surrey, B.C.,

taking second.

The Flamingos won the color guard competition in A division, with the Cascades of Seattle second and the Thunderbirds of Lynnwood, Wash., third.
