## about the FILIPINO YOUTH ACTIVITIES OF SEATTLE, Inc.

THE FYA, as it is popularly called, is a recognized youth agency, governed and operated by adult volunteers, known as moderators, for the purpose of providing wholesome and constructive cultural, social, educational and athletic programs during the leisure time of children and teen-agers who are Filipino either by blood, adoption, foster care or guardianship, regardless of creed or religion and while they are away from the care of the home, church or school. Founded in 1957, the FYA is the only youth agency in the nation, established solely for the leisure time welfare of Filipino American children from pre-school through age 19.

With an attempt to maintain a well-balanced schedule throughout the year for both grade school and teen-age youth, the FYA prefixes its more well-known programs like the Seafair Little Royalty, the Teen Club, the Caba'taan Folk Dancers, the Order of the Tamaraw, its newest activity - the Junior Gleemen - and the drill team, your hostesses and hosts this afternoon in the persons of the Princesas and Cumbancheros.
