These groups helped pave the way for the growing activity and led to the development of Drum Corps West, an association of drum corps that provided judges and presented shows.







DAVE ROSS

ave Ross grew up in New York and joined KIRO Radio in 1978. He hosted The Dave Ross Show for 25 years, ran for Congress in 2004 and now hosts Seattle's Morning News on KIRO-FM.

He's been a commentator for CBS Radio since 1992, and has received five Edward R. Murrow awards for writing and commentary.

Dave is a graduate of Cornell University, played clarinet and marched in the Big Red Band. He's also performed with the Seattle Gilbert and Sullivan Society, Seattle Radio Theater and the Tacoma Concert Band.





JUDGING & SCORING

nstructors and designers from Drum Corps International's member corps create the judging system. What might seem obvious on the surface may be masked by the complexity of DCI's judging system, which combines the creativity of a corps' program and the outstanding performers who bring the show to life. There is a maximum of 100 points based on the following criteria and number of points awarded in 6 categories by 8 judges.

- General Effect (2 judges, 20 points each). 1 judges music, the other visual. They judge what the show is offering intellectually, aesthetically and emotionally and respond to what the show actually is accomplishing.
- Music and Visual Analysis (1 judge for music, 1 judge for visual, 20 points each halved before final score). These are the most classically trained adjudicators as well as the most scientific in determining how well the music and visual components fit together into a seamless, unified presentation.
- Visual Proficiency (1 judge, 20 points halved before final score). This field judge looks at small groups and individuals, trying not to focus on any particular performer (formerly referred to as Field Visual and earlier Marching and Maneuvering).
- Color Guard (1 judge, 20 points halved before final score). This press box judge analyzes what the guard is doing and how well they are doing it.
- Brass (1 judge, 20 points halved before final score). This individual judges the quality of the brass section.
- Field Percussion (1 judge, 20 points halved before final score). This individual adjudicates individuals and small groups from the field.

n 2001, The Academy Brass & Percussion Ensemble was formed to give some of Arizona's finest young musicians an introduction to the incredibly unique activity of drum and bugle corps. Over the course of three summers, the young group of 52-60 performed for several local events and had taken the opportunity to perform in exhibition at its home show, the Southwest Corps Connection.

In 2004, the group added the final element of the color guard, was accepted as a DCI sanctioned unit, made the name change to The Academy Drum and Bugle Corps and began competing for the first time.

In 2006, the corps had grown to 135 members and competed for the first time in Drum Corps International World Championships in Madison, Wisconsin where they earned the title of Division II World Champion. 2007 marked their first year competing in Division I, now called World Class, where they continue to compete today.

In 2009, The Academy was named the official drum and bugle corps of the City of Tempe.

2016 marked an historic season for the corps with its first appearance in World Class Finals competition, placing 11th overall.

The corps is well on its way to providing another amazing season to 150 young adults in 2018.

he original Oregon Crusaders was founded in 1971 by brothers David and Ron Jones, ages 15 and 16, who had previously participated in the Seattle Sentinels and the Imperial Cadets. They wanted to have a Willamette Valley drum corps.

The Oregon Crusaders' mission is to provide education through performance to youth in the areas of musical and visual ensemble artistry.

Through the group's achievement of artistic and performance excellence, Oregon Crusaders provides the educational, cultural, interpersonal, physical and emotional growth necessary for young people to persevere and excel in life.

OC employs some the most talented design and instructional professionals in the country, who design programs that over 250 talented performers convey through a powerful, athletic and artistic performance.





The entire SCV organization strives to create a positive atmosphere where young people oan grow and mature into responsible young adults; succeeding both as individuals and as members of a tightly woven group.

Over the years, the Santa Clara Vanguard has developed a longstanding reputation for dignity and excellence. SCV has the distinction of being the only organization to be a finalist in Drum Corps International (DCI) World Championships since the inception of DCI in 1972.

We were the first organization in Drum Corps International (DCI) history to have a World Class and Open Class Champion; along with being the first organization to have a World Class and Open Class (formerly Division II) corps in the elite Top 17 (Semifinals) of DCI World Championship competitions.

The SCV organization has two competitive drum and bugle corps, the Vanguard and the Vanguard Cadets, the Vanguard Winter Guard, Winter Percussion and Community Arts Program.


