## BEAVER STATE BEAT



Something happy, something sad in the

formed. Mr. Lee Allen of Pendleton was  
the director at the time. Yours truly was  
the only one left five years later that can  
still tell of that night. The older members,  
these being in the corps from at least  
1961, took part in a program that was  
directed, edited and produced by Mrs. J.H.  
Tillman of Athena. It told the story of  
the corps up to the present time. I think

corps than appears on the surface.

A cake was later served in the Home Ec-

and myself. A few of you might remember  
George White from the Seattle V.F.W.  
Nationals in Seattle in 1963. He placed  
3rd in Baritone in the individuals.

Day parade held in Athena this year, I was  
shocked to learn from Roger Allen (the  
Lone Ranger) that the Lancers of Portland  
are folding. I found this hard to believe,  
until two days later when I got a letter

and plans to get new instruments and uni-  
forms. Roger Allen is going to instruct  
the drum line.
