Jack Avery remained as Director under successive Business Managers Jack Farmer, Tom Leonard, Rod Stubbs, Ed Grinolds, John O'Neal and George Laumin until this year. With the growth of a Cadet Corps to assure the continuity of "THUNDERBIRDS" musicianship the combined duties became too numerous for one man. Jack Avery has continued on in the capacity of his greatest interest . . . instilling the pride and love of good musicianship in the Cadet Corps. The Corps recognizes his contribution of effort and the value of the area of his greatest abilities . . . working with young new members who aspire to be the future "THUNDERBIRDS."

The numerous trophies, awards and citations won by the group are common knowledge as is their continued contribution of innovations to upgrade corps activity in the Northwest.

The highlight of last years activity was the VFW National Competitions at Cleveland where the Corps acquitted itself notably as best of western contingent and the Color Guard placed ninth.

Over 6,000 miles was logged per corps member last year in fulfilling some 50 turnouts plus the many practices, paper drives, meetings, dinners and other activities engaged in by this very active corps.

The Corps operates under the original concept of a family activity with parents supplying the basic transportation needs.

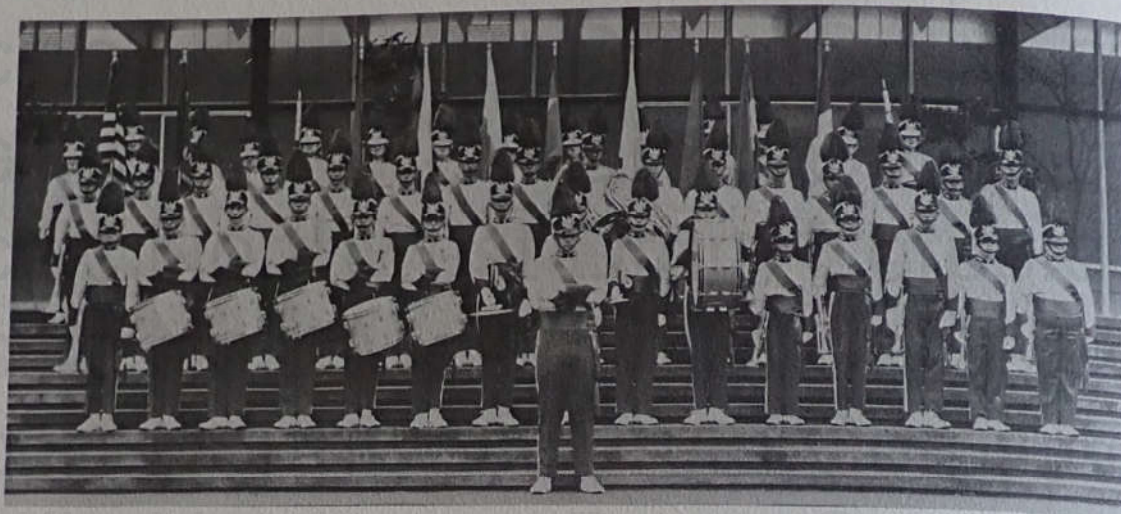
The Corps will continue to upgrade its efforts toward excellence.

The Corps also appeared and placed in many parades and the Individuals have maintained their consistently fine showings in all Individuals competitions.

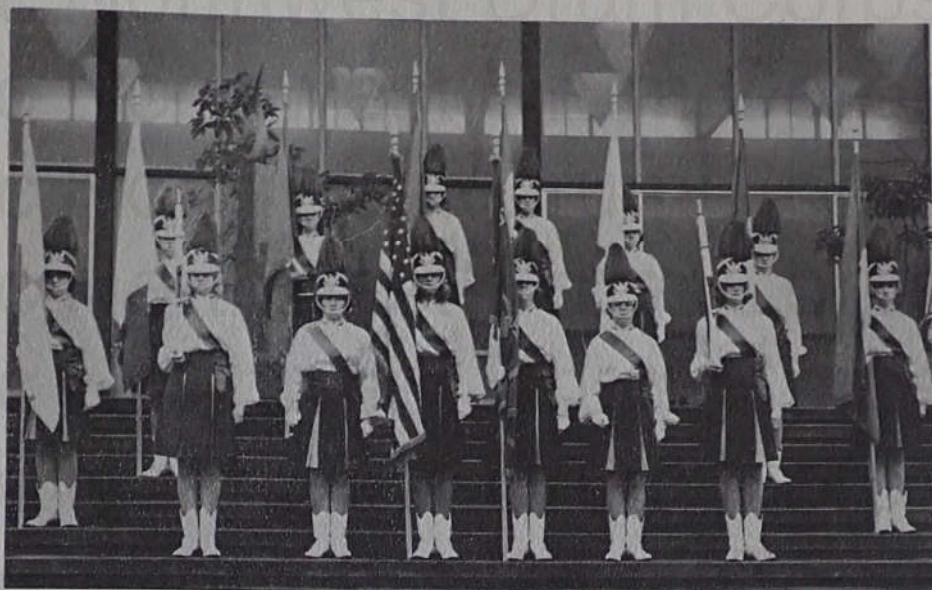
The Corps has maintained its active pace of appearing in every possible Competition since its formation. This year began with Firsts in Federal Way Parade and Salem Optirama.

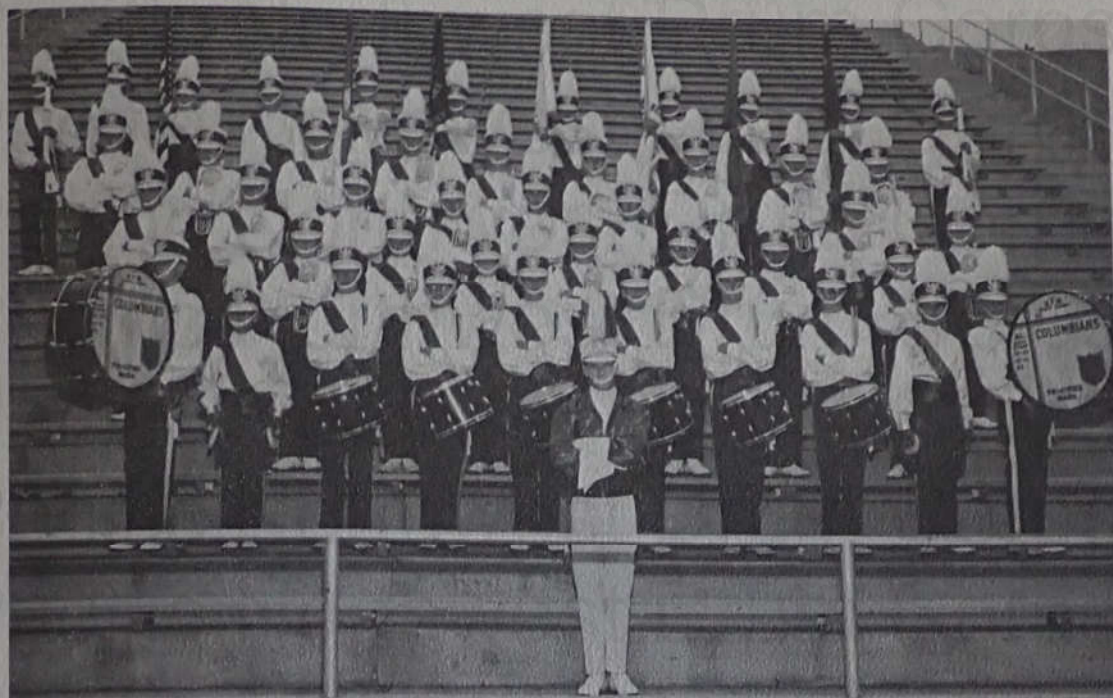

"THE BRITISH COLUMBIA REGIMENT" (Duke of Connaught's Own) Drum and Bugle Corps entered last years "THUNDERBIRDS" Pacific Northwest Championships Competition after having exhibited therein the year before.

The Regiment was founded in 1883 and converted to a rifle formation in 1899 from which time the present band has been in existence. Originally using only 'horns' as the early type bugles were known, drums were added during the First World War. The Regiment was converted to tanks during World War Two, but many traditions of the Rifle Brigade were retained, including the Drum and Bugle Corps, regimental rather than armoured corps insignia, the dark green uniforms for the band and the cross-belts worn with dress uniforms by senior ranks.

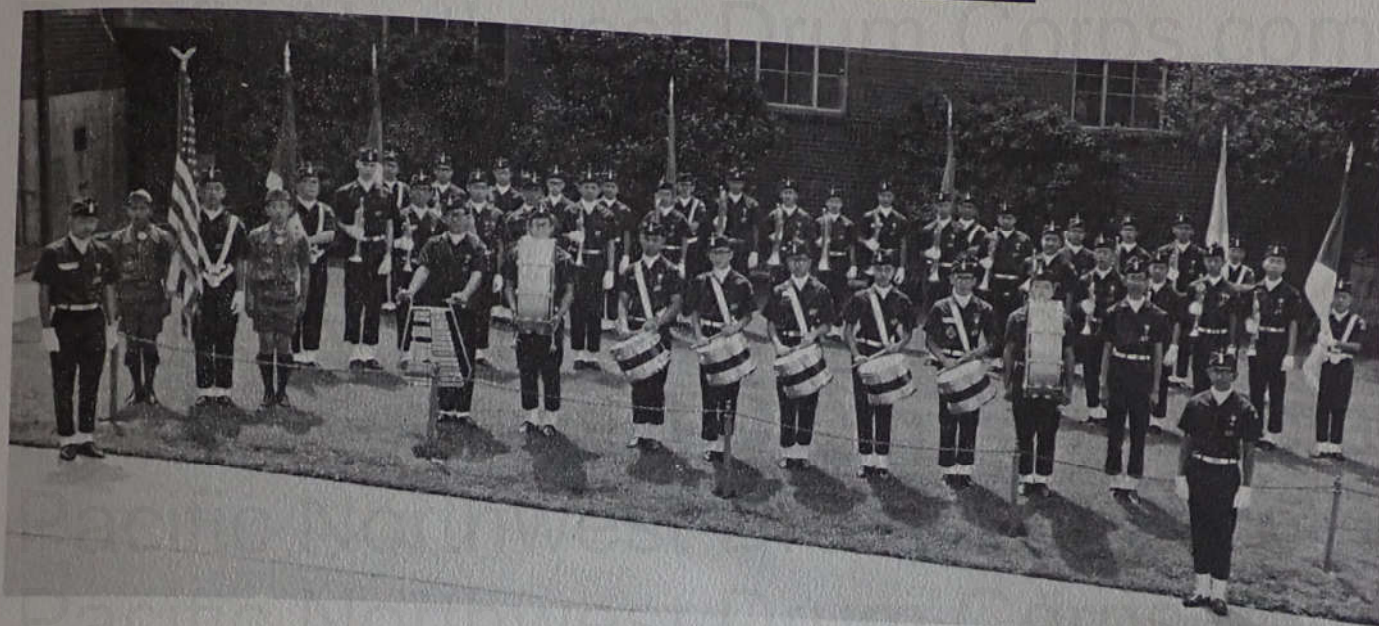
The band proudly shares the traditions and the 21 Battle Honors of three wars. It takes part in all Ceremonial and Church Parades and was specially praised by his Excellency, Major General Vanier, Governor-General of Canada, upon the presentation of its 'Guidon'.

A little over three years ago the Corps adopted one valve trumpets, added glockenspiels and music reading and harmony were taught for the first time.

The Corps returns as a formidable contender for top Senior Corps regional honors.

The "SEATTLE BUDDHIST SCOUTS" Drum and Bugle Corps was organized in 1952 by Boy Scout Troop 252 under the sponsorship of the Seattle Buddhist Church and reorganized in 1960. Increased scout corps members led to formation into tow units in 1963 — the Boy Scout Drum and Bugle Corps of Troop 252 and the Explorer Corps of Post 252 BSA. In 1964 the Explorer Post was chartered as a Drum and Bugle Corps Specialty Post. The full Explorer Post Scout program is maintained and the Corps has performed at Council scout shows in Portland, Bremerton and Everett in addition to yearly participation in the Chief Seattle Council Scout show.

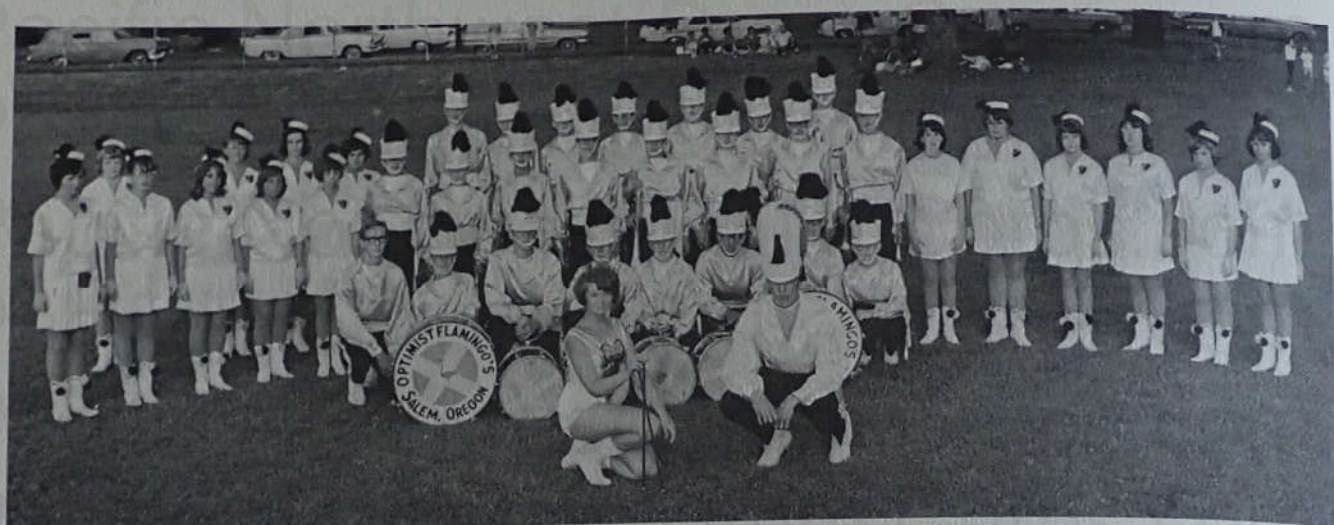
The SEATTLE BUDDHIST SCOUTS has been a very active and successful parade corps.

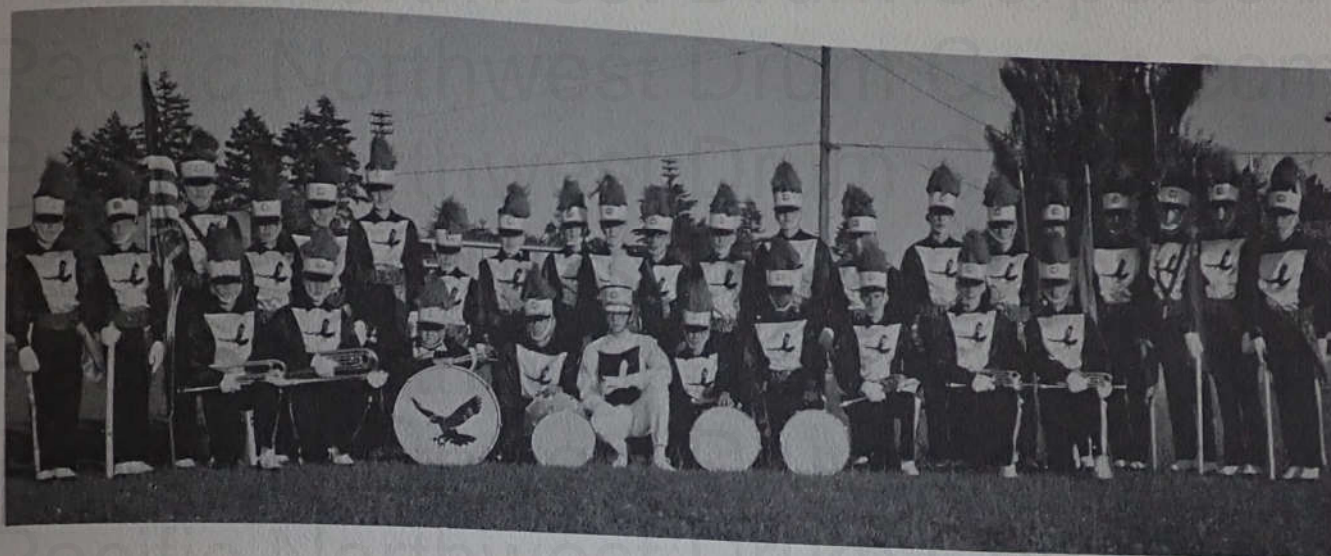

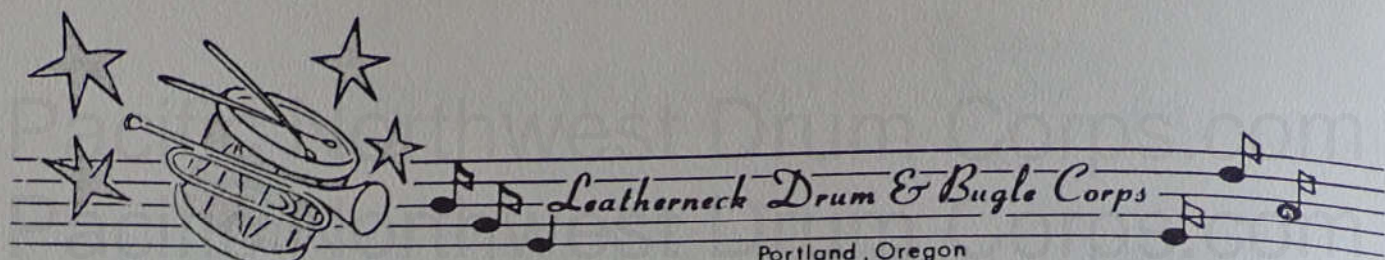
The "HAWKS" have twice held American Legion State Championships and last year took third after having to rebuild from a nucleus of only 8 members.

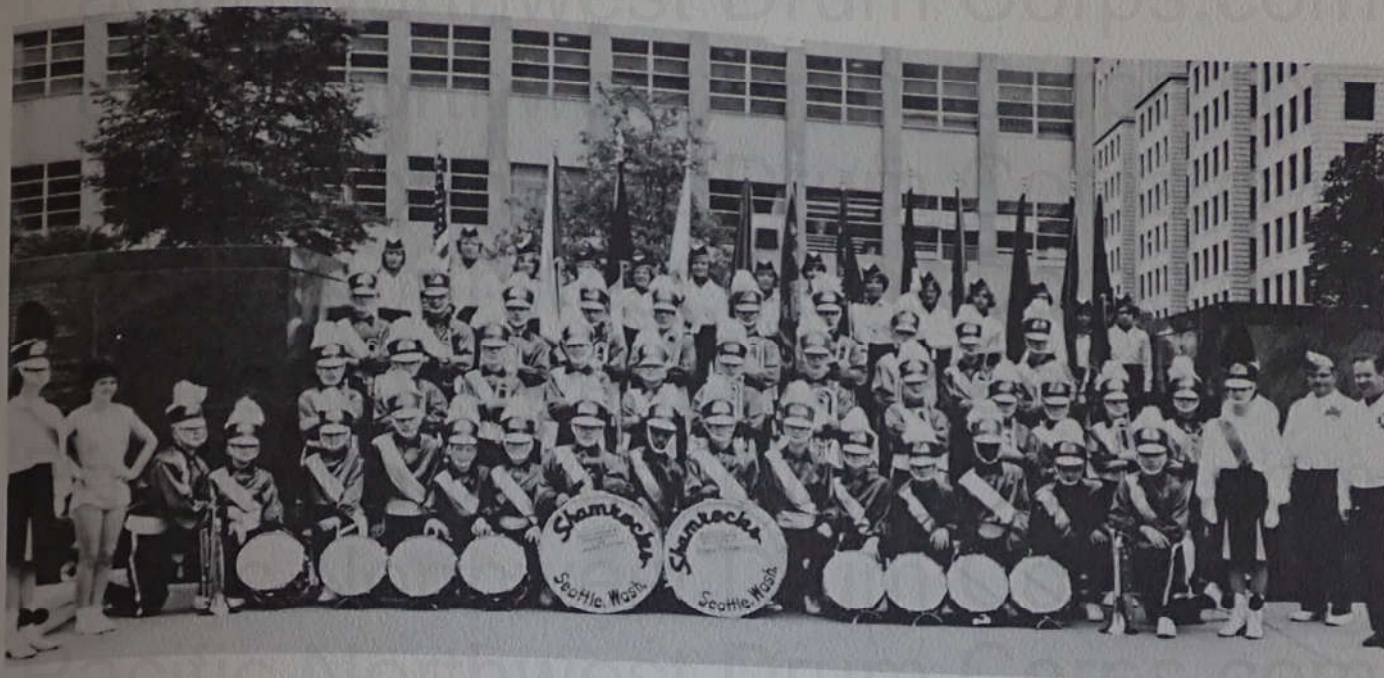

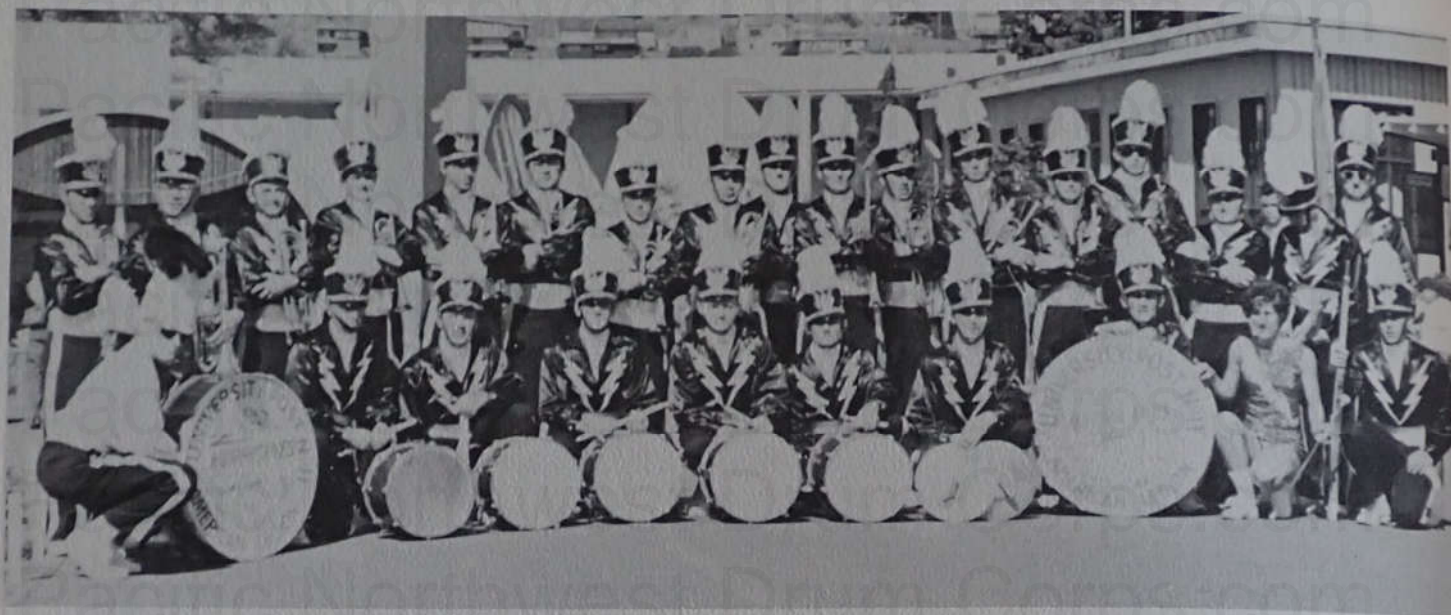
Fund raising affairs are being held for the purchase of new uniforms and equipment for the summer season. The girls have been self-supporting and their parents and sponsors are proud of their progress.
