PROCLAMATION

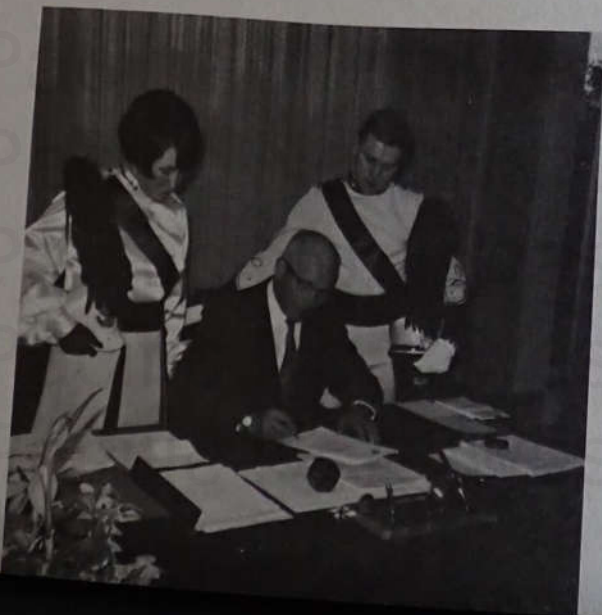



THE THUNDERBIRDS DRUM & BUGLE CORPS was first organized in 1958 and have progressed under successive Business Managers Jack Farmer, Tom Leonard, Rod Stubbs, Ed Grinolds, John O'Neil and for the past two years George Laumin. In 1963 a Cadet Corps was established to act primarily as a feeder corps for the "THUNDERBIRDS". The value of the Cadets was clearly demonstrated as over 50% of the membership moved up into the "THUNDERBIRDS" at the end of the 1965 competition season.

The numerous trophies, awards and citations won by the group are well known by people throughout the Seattle area and the Pacific Northwest. The "THUNDERBIRDS" are continuing to upgrade their efforts toward excellence.

The highlight of last years activity was the American Legion National Contest at Portland, Oregon where the Corps placed sixth, outscoring several highly touted California Corps. The Color Guard placed second, coming within a "half-step" of being National Champions.

Over 6000 miles was logged per Corps member last year in fulfilling some 58 turnouts plus the many practices, paper drives, candy sales, meetings, dinners, and other activities engaged in by this very active Corps.

The Thunderbirds are operated under the original concept of a family activity with parents supplying the basic transportation needs.

The high caliber of their performances since their formation was continued in 1965 with first places at the Salem Optirama, Salem Oregon, American Legion State at Wenatchee, Washington and the Drumkahana in Portland, Oregon. In August of 1965 their 2nd Place at the American Legion Nationals in Portland, Oregon was truly their greatest performance and is the highest that any west coast color guard has ever scored. They are headed back to the American Legion Nationals in Washington D.C. and VFW Nationals in New York City in August of this year with determination to "win it all".

The Cadet Corps was a consistent contender and made many fourth and fifth place showings last year. The highlight of the year was placing the highest of all "B" Corps at the American Legion State Competition at Wenatchee, Washington.

The growth of the Cadets has not been without significant administrative difficulties which created a major decision during the later part of the 1965 competition season. An appraisal was made to increase the size of the "THUNDERBIRDS", in order to be a top contender in the American Legion Nationals in Portland last August. It was necessary to "strip" the Cadets of those members capable of "moving up" to the more difficult music and marching demands. The value of a feeder Corps was clearly demonstrated, as the ultimate goal, of all Cadet members, is to become "Thunderbirds". In this respect, the Cadets enjoyed the most successful year in it's three year history.

The Cadets are not competing in this years Northwest Competition as at the present time are in the process of re-organization. Recruitment of new members will be stepped up as quickly as the "Thunderbirds" can get more drums, bugles, flags, etc. necessary to field a competing unit. They INTEND to be BACK in the "B" circuit learning basics and serving the original intent of a feeder unit.

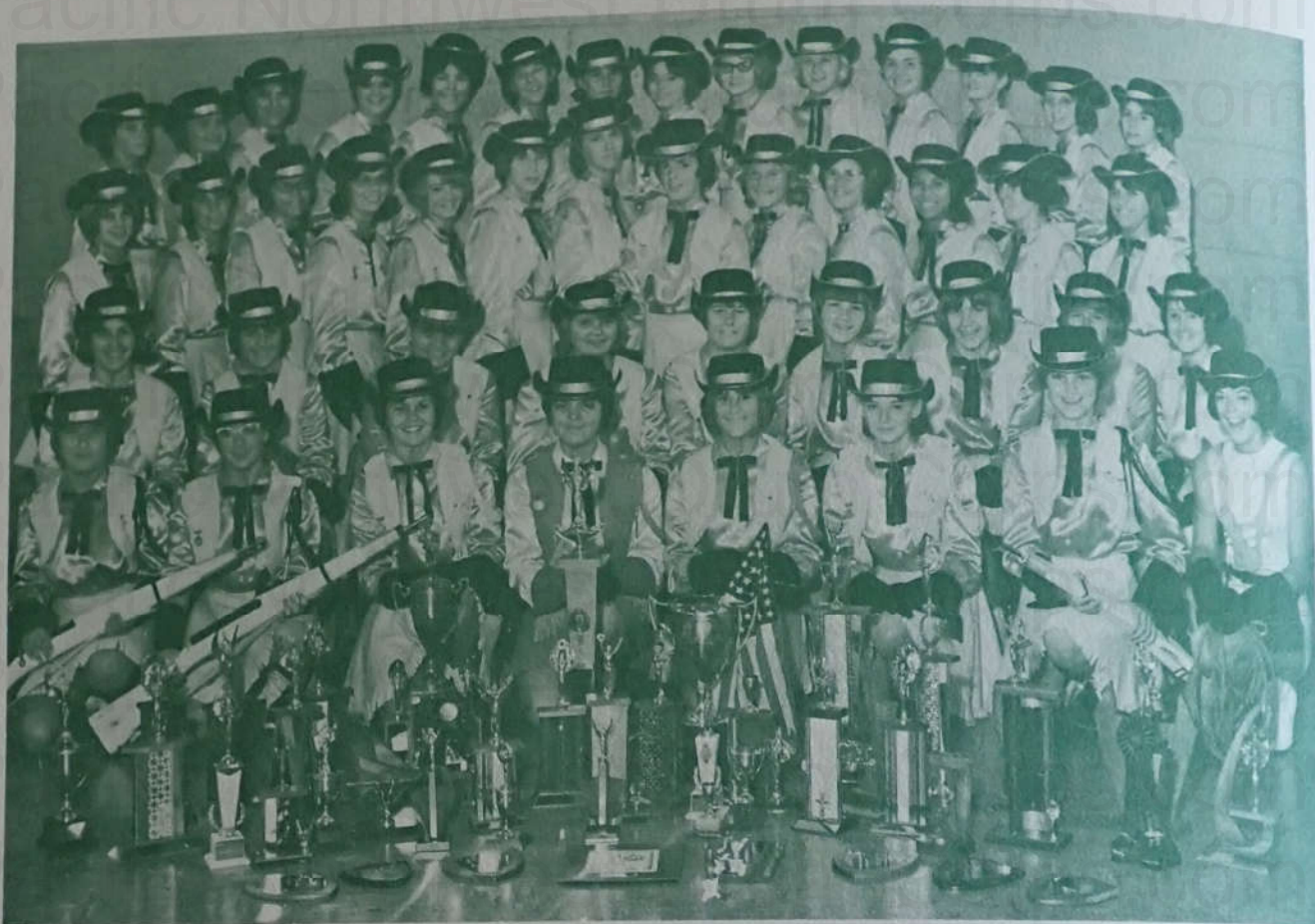

This Corps has won the American Legion State Championship the last two years in succession, (Senior Division).

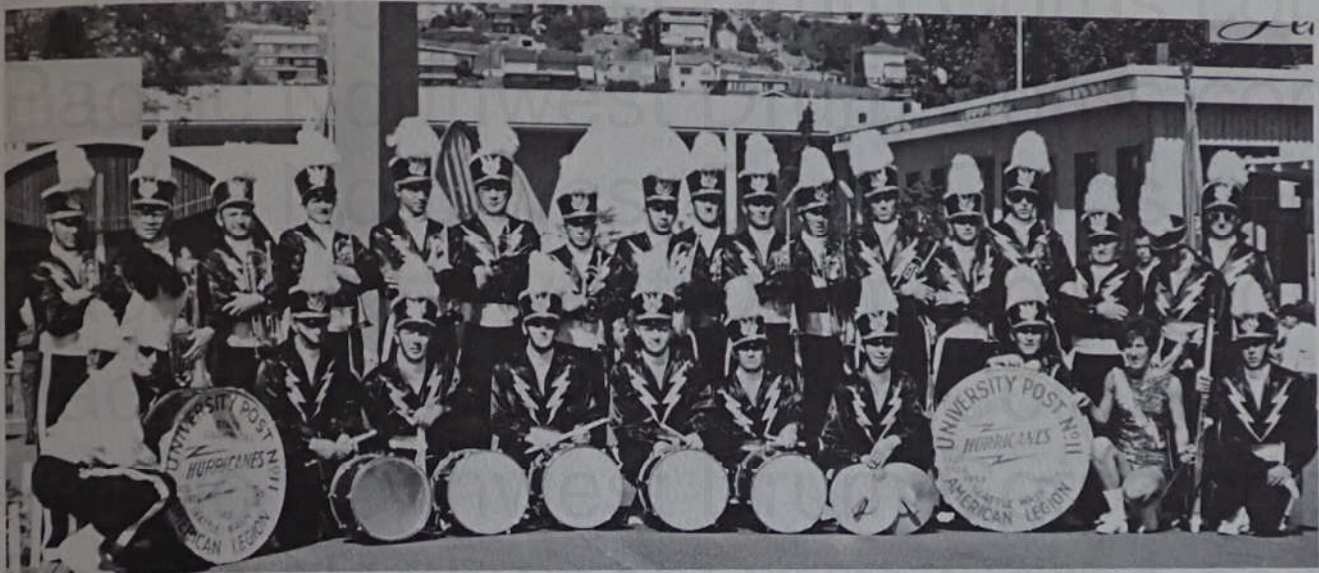
