The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada

The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada was formed on April 26th, 1860 and is older than Canada itself, having been raised seven years prior to confederation. During its 105 years, it has had the distinction of serving in every Theatre of Operations in which Canada has committed armed troops.

Beginning the QOR's century of service to the Dominion with the Fenian Raids of 1866, the Regiment carries Battle Honours from the North West Rebellion of 1885, the South African War and the two Great Wars. Service under the United Nations Flags has seen the Regiment in both Korea and Cyprus.

During the QOR's long service it has carried an impressive record of 41 battle honours, five Victoria Crosses and the distinction of leading the left assault wave of the Canadian Forces onto the Normandy Beaches on D-Day, 1944.

Proud of its long tradition, the Queen's Own is organized into three Battalions today, the 1st and 2nd being a part of the Canadian Regular Army, with the 3rd, militia unit, being stationed in Toronto, the Home of the Regiment. As a Rifle Regiment, the QOR's wear ceremonial dress uniforms of green and black with red trappings, march at 140 paces to the minute and carry no colours. Each year battalions of the Regiment execute an exacting test of ceremonial rifle drill when they fire a "Feu de Joie," normally in honour of the Regiment's Colonel in Chief, HRH Princess Alexandra of Kent. Well known for their marching ability, the Battalions perform the famous "double post" as part of this traditional parade and except for interruptions during the war years have staged their "Fire of Joy" every year of their long history.

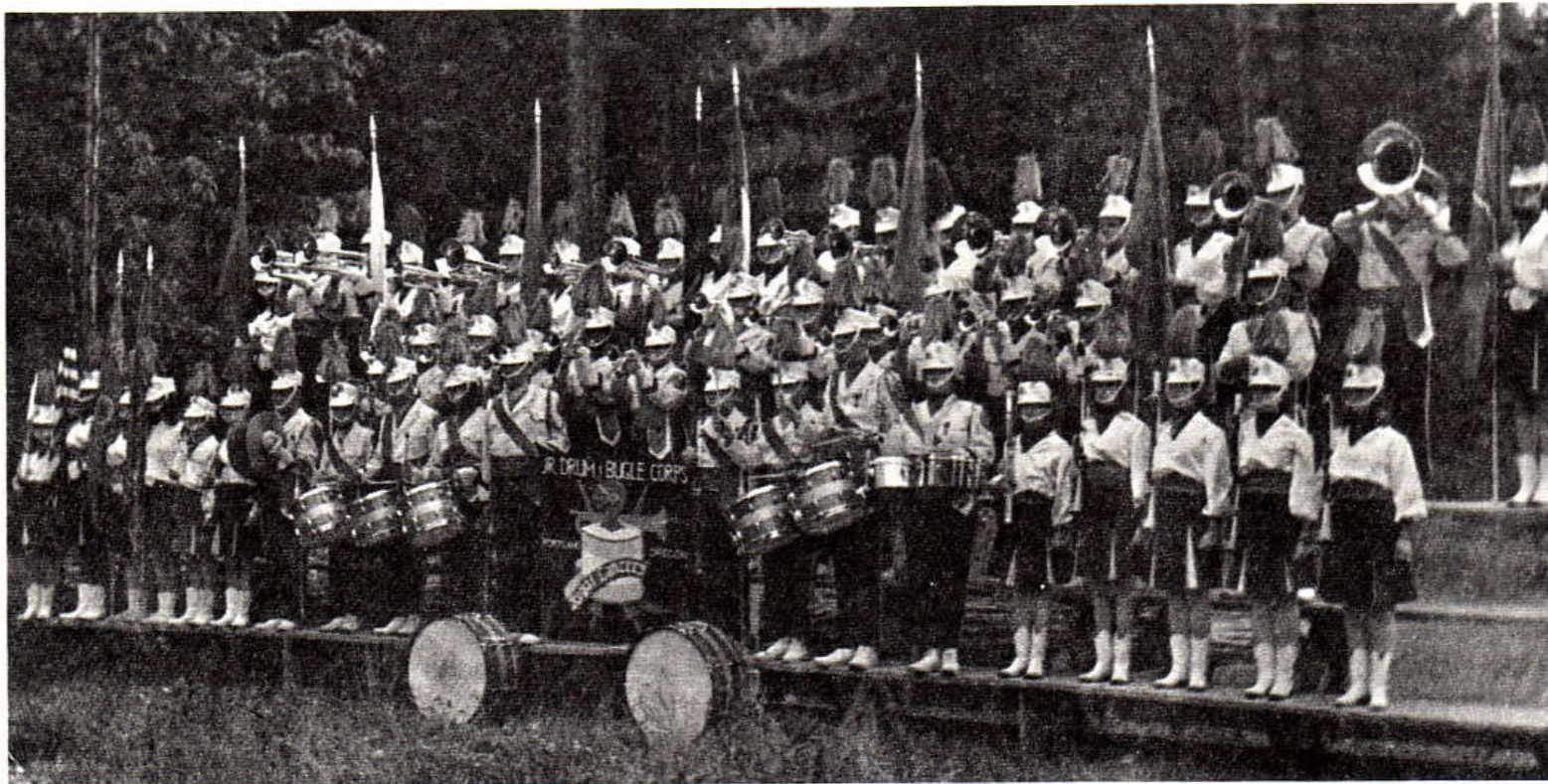

Perkins and Bugle Instructor is Brian Olson; Drum Instructor, Van Kennell, and Color Guard Counselor is Miss Terri Hutchens.

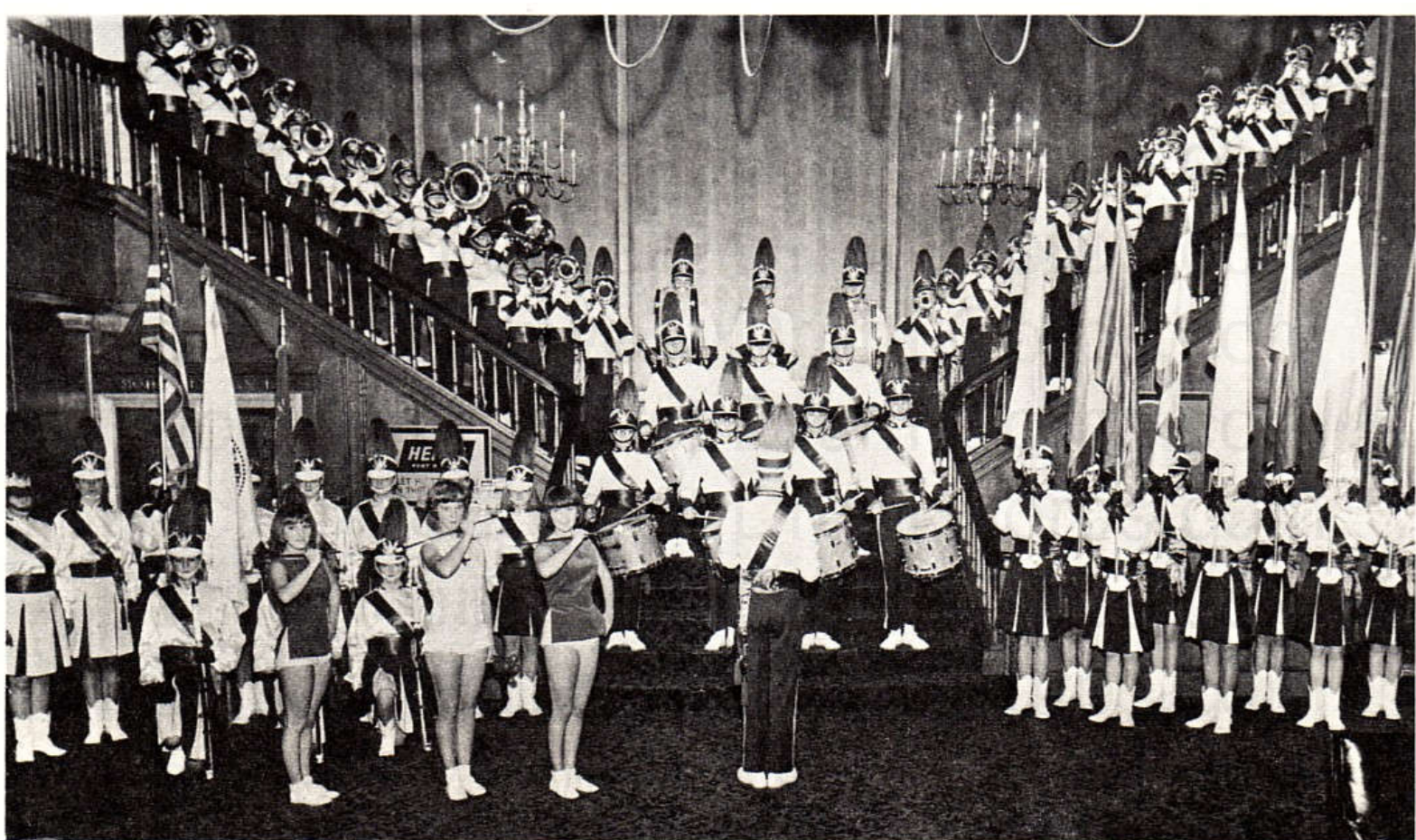

The Thunderbirds Drum & Bugle Corps was founded in 1958 by the Greenwood Boys Club with a nucleus of 36 boys. The Corps operates under the original concept of a family activity with the parents furnishing transportation for the Corps members to the many practices, turnouts and competitions during the year.

Numerous trophies, awards and citations won by the group are common knowledge as is their continued contributions of innovations to up-grade Corps activity in the Northwest.

The highlight of 1966 was the All-American Judges Competition in Anaheim, Calif., at which they were

awarded 1st place. The Thunderbirds are the first Junior Corps in the State of Washington to hold a National Title. On this same trip they were also awarded the Disneyland Grand Sweepstakes Award.

The Thunderbirds are winners of V.F.W. State, American Legion State, and the Western Canadian Drum & Bugle Corps Competition. They also hold the 1966 Washington State Drum Corps Incentive Trophy for being the top Corps in the State.

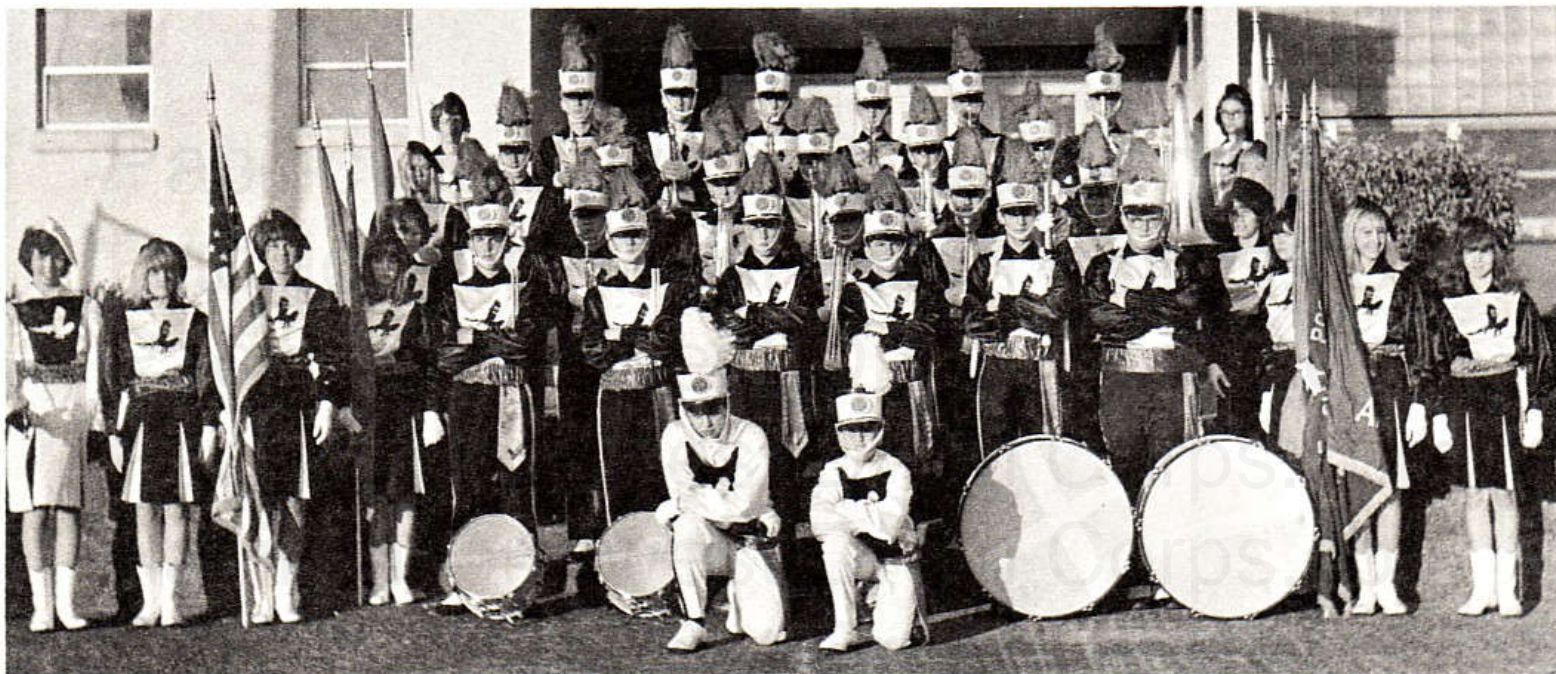
Sportsmanship Trophy

and in July of 1965 won the State Championship of Oregon.

The Color Guard didn't fare to well at the 1966 Optirama placing 5th out of nine competing guards. The competition between Color Guards and the Drum and Bugle Corps was becoming tougher so the girls went to work and placed 3rd at Drumkana, 1st at Hillsboro, 2nd at Oregon State Legion Competition losing their championship by only 1.2 points.

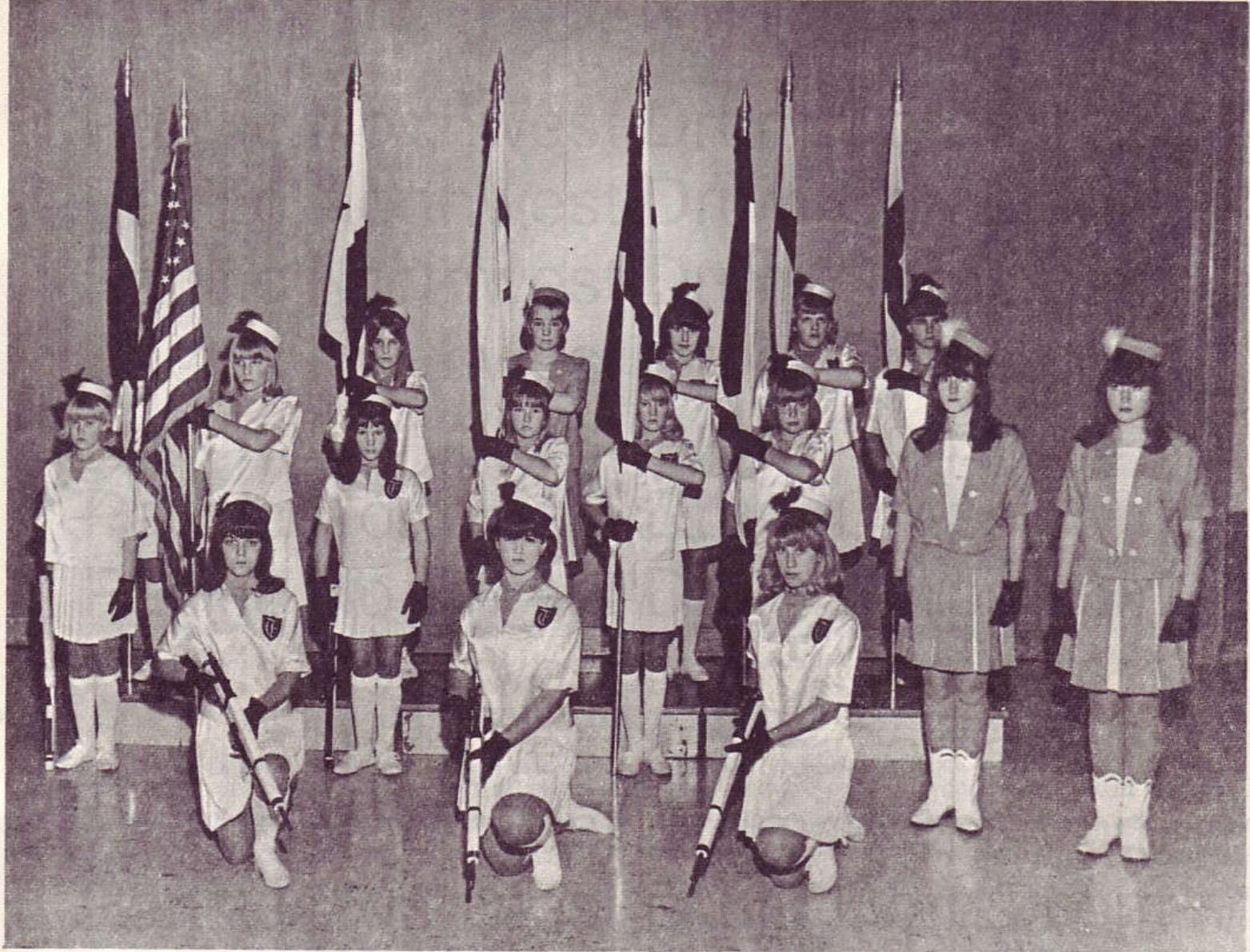
