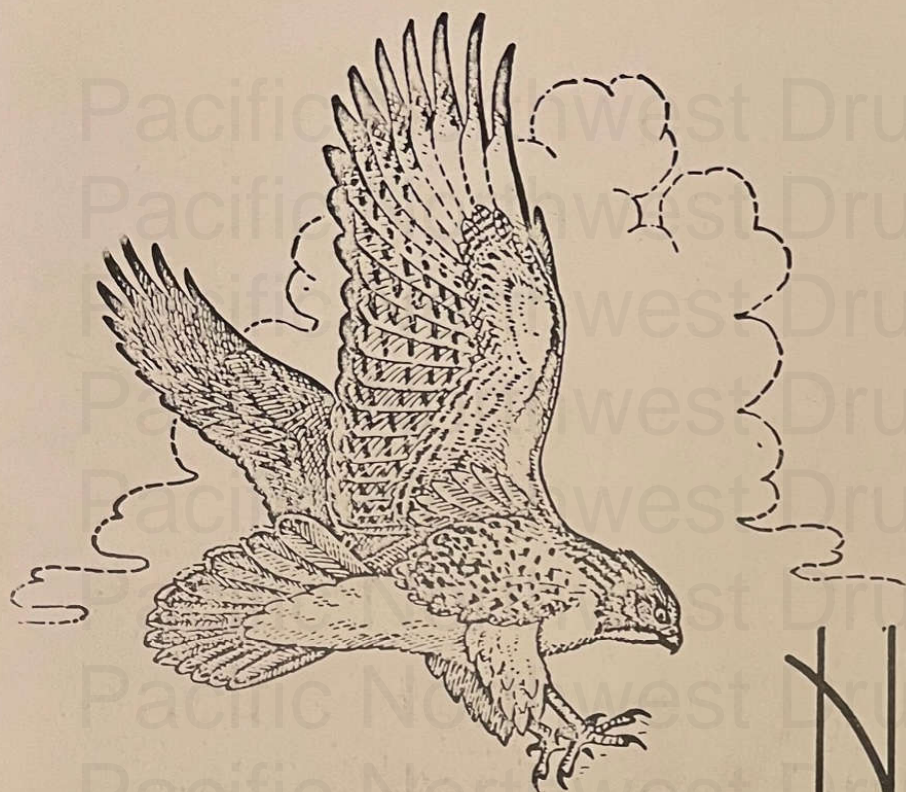

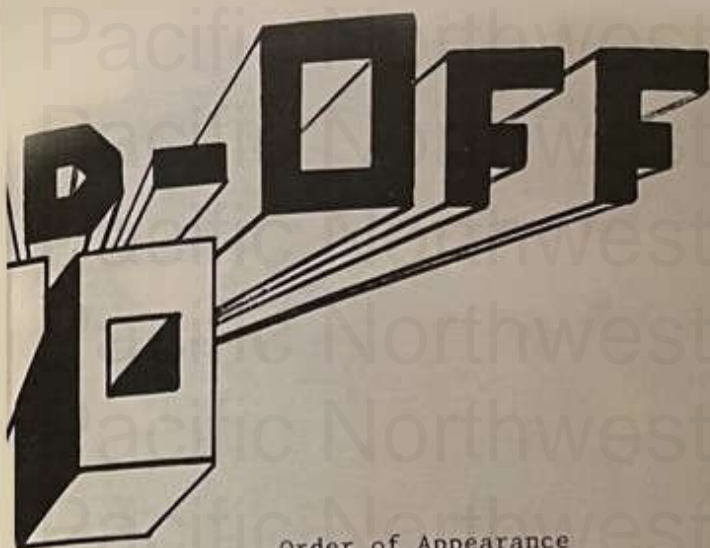

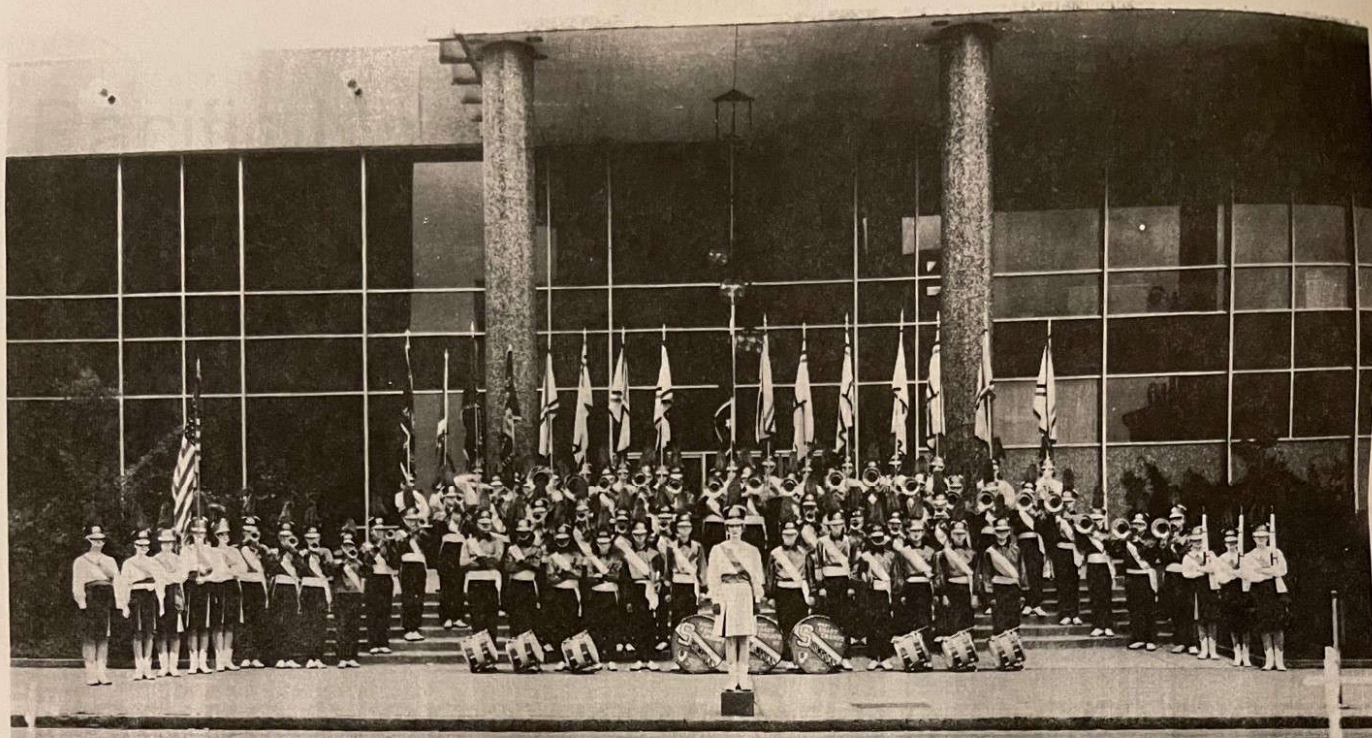
"THE FLAMINGOS"
