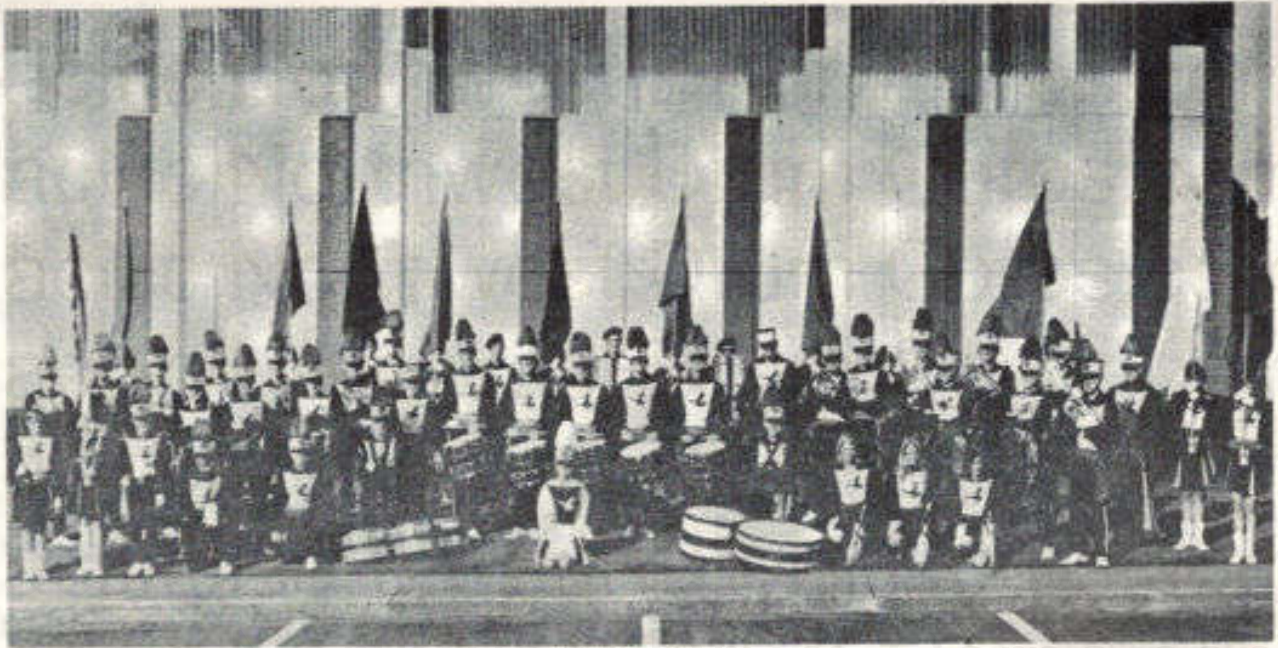
CASCADES

The Cascades Drum and Bugle Corps was organized in June, 1966, by Rod Stubbs and Jack Avery. Since that time the corps has participated in parades and competitions throughout the Northwest. The years 1969 and 1970 were successful seasons in which the Cascades' parade record topped all the other corps in the area and resulted in their being named parade champions. The Color Guard was Northwest Champions for 1968 and 1969 and North Division Champions in 1970. The corps placed second in the American Legion State Competition in 1970 and third in the VFW State contest. The Cascades were proud of winning first place honors in the P. N. E. parade in Vancouver, B. C. in 1968, 1969 and 1970. The corps traveled to Portland, Oregon, to climax the summer season with the Color Guard placing fifth in the American Legion National Convention competition.

This year, with over 50% new members, a new drill and mostly all new music, we plan to field a strong 90 member corps which hopefully will jell into an even more competitive corps.

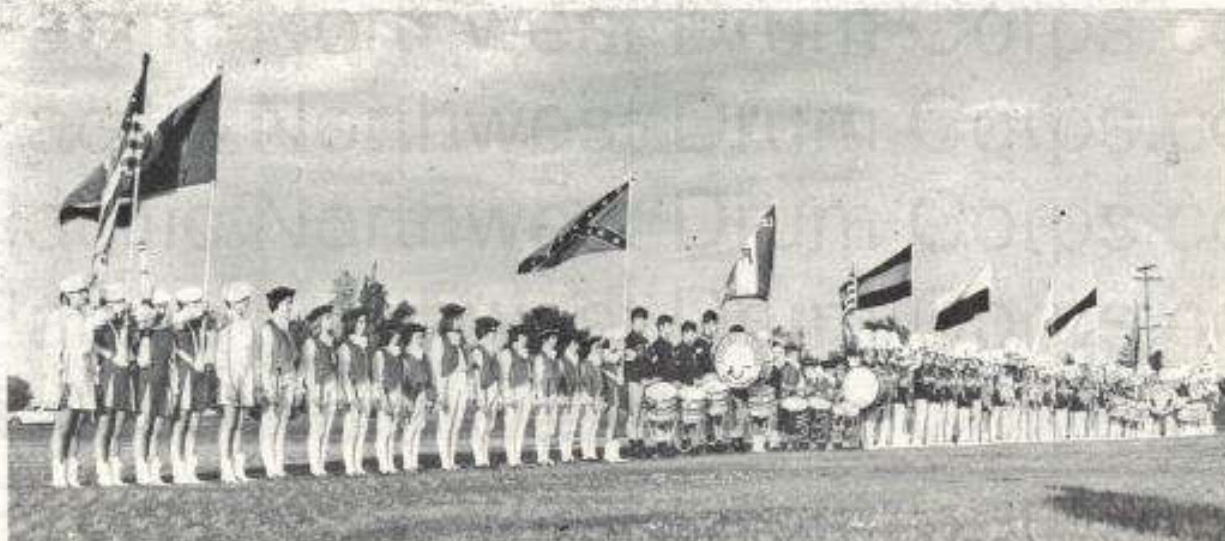

Formed in 1961 as a seven-member percussion ensemble, the Percussion-Naut Patriots have today a membership of 95.

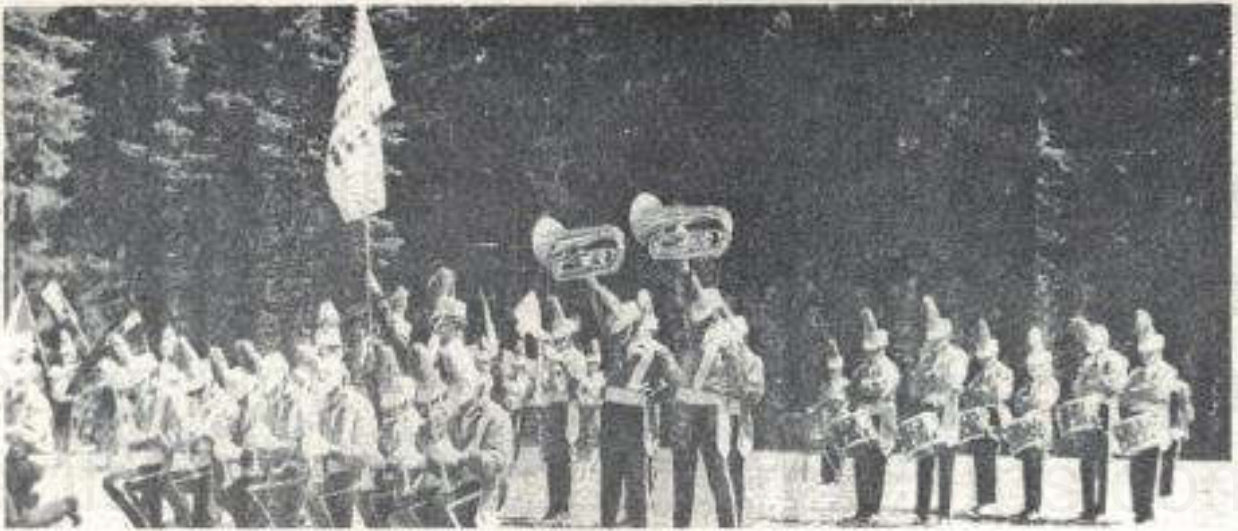

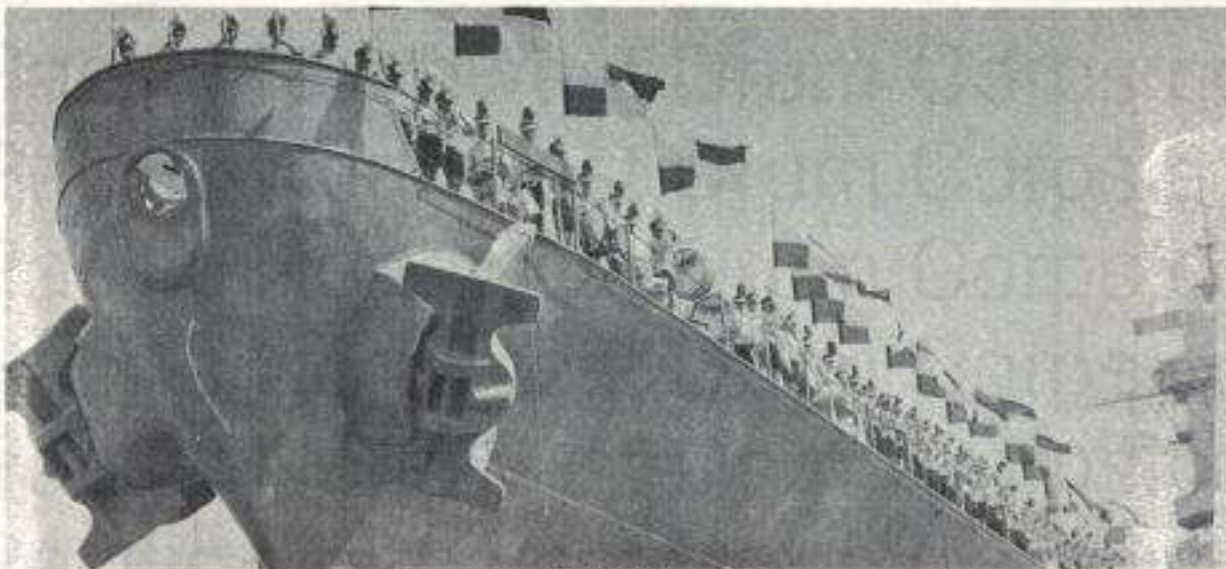




The "Columbians" were organized in the 1930's and were know as the American Legion Drum and Bugle Corps. It was disbanded during WWLL and revivied in 1955, when it was expanded to include Kennewick and Richland. The Corps participated in the American Legion Nationals in 1961 in Denver; placed 5th in 1962 American Legion Nationals at Las Vegas; 7th in Seattle at the VFW Nationals in 1963; were Washington State Drum & Bugle Corps Champions in 1964; and placed 10th in Portland at the American Legion Nationals in 1965. The Corps did not compete in 1969 or 1970 and was re-organized in July of 1970. In February, 1971, the new Columbians placed 1st in the "B" Class at the Sectoma Sound Off in Portland and last week took 1st place honors in both Pasco and Pendleton. The sponsors of the Columbians are American Legion Post #34 in Pasco and the VFW Post #1651. For the past several years the "Cavalcade of Drums" has been a Columbian show in cooperation with the Tri-City Water Follies, and this show was held July 17, 1971, in Pasco.

## DRIFTERS

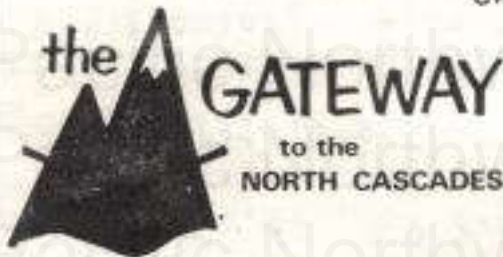
