This widely known and well travelled band is comprised of 44 boys and 36 girls, between the ages of 11 and 19.

Sporting uniforms of maroon and white, this group gained wide spread publicity after breaking all records at the Toronto Canadian National Exhibition by winning all five trophies.

In 1970 this group travelled to Expo 70 in Japan and last year received an overwhelming reception at the Billingham Music Festival in the North of England, resulting in a second invitation being extended for their appearance in the 1975 festival.

This year's performance will be their fourth performance at Edmonton's Klondike Days in the past six years. They are the only band to have received recognition as "Honourary Sourdoughs" of the City of Edmonton . . . presented to the band on the final day of their 1972 visit here.

Uniformed in the dress of the Beefeaters (burnt orange and ebony) this high stepping marching band has collected over 150 awards for their music excellence in Canada and the U.S.

The Beefeaters have been featured at Canada's World Fair in Montreal, the Grey Cup Parade and a number of festivals in Europe. The band was also officially appointed to represent Canada at the New York and Seattle World's fairs.

This is the Beefeaters first trip to Edmonton and we welcome them to the Band Extravaganza Competition.

Highland High Marching Band — Pocatello, Idaho

Highland's marching unit has performed in parades in Utah and Idaho. They have put on half time shows for several universities, including Idaho State University, University of Utah, Weber State College, and BYU. The band members practice entirely on their own time before school starts. The marching girls practice partially on their own time and partially on school time, 2½ hours each day. The students raised almost \$14,000 to make the trip. This is the first time the unit has performed outside the U.S.

Judging a Marching Band Competition

Each marching band can earn a possible 1,000 points during their 11-13 minute performance tonight. Of this, 900 points is based on the band music.

For the 900 points in Band Music, the judges allow a maximum of 100 points for each of the following: Instrumentation; Conducting; Interpretation; Expression; Intonation.

Two hundred points are allowed for: Articulation and Ensemble.

The remaining 100 points can be earned through the marching and maneuvering (maximum 75 points) and the overall effectiveness of the band (maximum 25 points).

JUDGES

There are nine judges tonight who will be evaluating each of the competing marching bands and drum corps. The judges are from Ontario and Quebec, and are all members of the Canadian Judges Association.

Judging A Drum Corps Competition

Each Drum and Bugle Corps can earn a possible 750 points during their 11-13 minute performance tonight. These points are divided into three main categories:

General Effect — a total of 300 points, with 100 points allowed in each of the three sub-categories: (1) Percussion; (2) Marching and Maneuvering; (3) Brass.

Second Category with a total value of 250 points is Bugling, with a maximum of 100 points allowed for musical analysis and 150 points for execution.

The final category is Drumming with a maximum of 200 points allowed for execution-exposure.

The Hawks, drum and bugle corps is the oldest group of this kind in the Portland area and have been consistently top performers since they began operation in 1959.

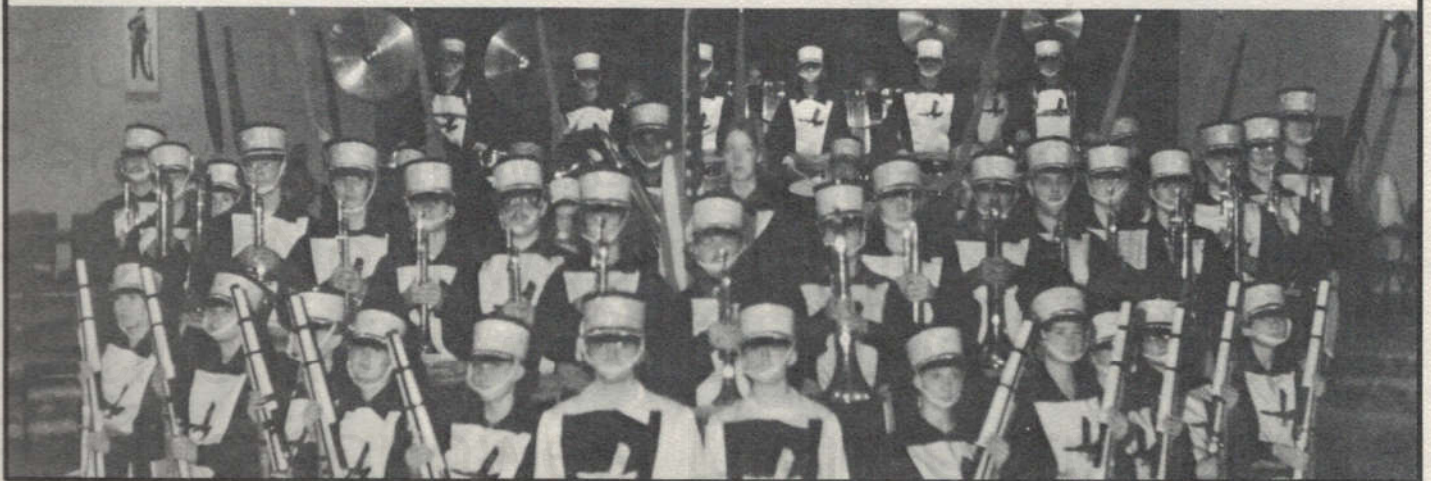
Placing second in last year's North West Drum and Bugle Corps Championship has been only one of their many credits over the years.
