

DR. ROBERT E. LINDSEY

Dr. Robert E. Lindsey was first elected Mayor of Salem, Oregon in 1972 and was re-elected for a two-year term in 1974. He served on the City Council as an Alderman for six years prior to his election. Dr. Lindsey, a practicing dentist, resides in Salem with his wife, Pat, and his family of six children.

Mayor Lindsey resided in Great Falls, Montana from 1944 through 1953, where he attended Great Falls High School and the College of Education. He graduated from the School of Dentistry of Creighton University at Omaha, Nebraska in 1957, and he opened his dental office in Salem in July of that year.

During his term of service the number of neighborhood organizations has grown to a total of seven active groups. Urban renewal progress has given Salem the State Accident Insurance Fund Building, the City Parking Structure, the Mill Race redevelopment, the Pringle Parkway and the Pringle Northbank projects.





A new Junior Drum Corps appears on the competitive scene. In September, 1975 the initial meeting was held to form a new Drum Corps in Spokane, Washington. With an initial start of some 20 potential Corps members and some interested parents, it was decided to undertake the organization of a new unit. Renaissance was selected as the name of the new Drum Corps.

The first public appearance for the Renaissance was in the annual Valley parade on October 4th. The marching consisted of around 40 Drum Corps hopefuls with white T-shirts and blue jeans as the uniform, instruments any thing they had, owned, or could borrow. Practices have continued from that point with our first major being the appearance in Salem at the Optirama in January.

Renaissance has progressed at this time to take on the true appearance of a Drum Corps with the acquisition uniforms, and percussion equipment. The membership is continuing to grow; drill design and music are way for summer drill, and the entire group is looking forward with much enthusiasm to summer com-

Corps director and percussion instruction is handled by Dave Wakeley; brass instruction by Jerry Knudsen; Executive Director and business manager is Gene Brower.


