

# HOW A DRUM AND BUGLE CORPS IS JUDGED

In order to understand how a drum corps is judged, the novice in the stands seeing his first contest must realize one thing, drum and bugle corps as you see it tonight is one of America's true art forms. It's concepts method of judging instruments have been developed to fit the needs of the developing activity. All the music drum and bugle have been specially arranged for each unit as well as each drill that is presented.

Judging is not to expose the big errors that are at times obvious to the viewer in the stands but to the small technical errors that are only noticeable to the trained eye, or ear. 60% of the scoring is based on tich system, for every error, 1/10 of a point, 1 tick, is deducted, this 60% of score is in the execution captions, 40% of the score is on a build up caption, that is the General Effects G.E. areas of judging.

The Captions:

Marching & Manuevering M & M:

This is the ability of a unit to march, how well they keep a line straight, the spacing between men is equal, all the flags go down and up together, out of step, that each member carries himself well, with pride and dignity.

General Effects:

This is a build up caption, and is scored on how well the corps presents its program (marching) that all areas of the show are fully developed to please the crowd.

**Brass Execution:** 

This is judged on the tick system and the brass section is judged on its ability to play together, its attacks and releases, cracked notes, and if the horn is brought up and down together.

Bugle G.E.:

This is a build up caption and is much like G.E. Marching. It is scored on how much emotion is brought out from the crowd and the judge, how well the music fits together and general appeal.

Music Analysis:

This is a build up caption, and is to analyze the correlation of the music to the other areas of the drill, the difficulty of the musical presentation.

Drumming Execution:

The drum line is judged much like the horn line in this caption, also a tick caption, each section must play its part well together, stick heights must be even, each player must hit his drum in the same area.

Drum G.E.:

Also a build up caption, is judged on the varied off rhythm patterns used, how the drum music fits the horn music, and the appeal of the drumline to the crowd.

Last, one must remember that in all captions the key to judging is based on the uniformity within the section, the ability to do it well together.



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

# Drums along the Potomac

WASHINGTON, D.C. (special to The NEWS) — They started out with shivers, but before they had marched down Pennsylvania Avenue the 117 members of the Black Watch Drum and Bugle Corps were all smiles.

Marching about two hours behind newly-inaugurated President Jimmy Carter, the group of South King County teenagers culminated a last minute, \$40,000 fund raising drive and a crosscountry flight with a performance that could only be described as exemplary.

Following a noon swearing-in ceremony on the capital steps, thousands of onlookers from every state in the Union were lined deep to see the hundreds of floats, marching units, bands and the official Washington State Black Watch.

The group was met at Baltimore's Friendship Airport shortly after 6 a.m. on Wednesday by the new sixth District Congressman, Norm Dicks. S The group was then bused to Fort Mead, Md. near the airport where they spent three nights. They returned to Sea-Tac Airport yesterday.

The award winning group, which is comprised of young musicians from the Federal Way-Auburn area, was led in the parade by four Washington State Troopers and Director Dan Anderson of Federal Way. The Black Watch was the only entry from Washington State and was the official representative for Governor Dixy Lee Ray.

TEMPERATURES DIPPED below 10 degrees in the days preceding the inaugural, but a clear sky and near 40 degree temperatures welcomed the capital visitors

Following the three hour parade and the series of inaugural balls, Thursday night, the group spent most of Friday sight-seeing and visiting monuments and buildings including the White House and the Lincoln, Jefferson and Washington monuments.




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#### Being a rookie in the Black Watch

## KENNEDY CONTINENTALS

The Kennedy "Continentals" Drum & Bugle Corps was formed just a year ago at John F. Kennedy Memorial High School.

Kennedy Hi is a private parochial High School, coed, located in Burien and serving the entire South Seattle areas. The school was founded less than ten years ago, has a student body of 1200 and is staffed by priests, nuns, and laymen and women of the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle. Kennedy began a music program two years ago, and has included Drum & Bugle Corps within the scope of this program. All students at Kennedy are eligible to participate in the Corps.

The Kennedy Continentals began as the "mouchoirs" drums & bugles of last year. The unit's goals for last summer were merely exhibition and parades in order to get moving and gain experience. Taking first place in the West Seattle Hi-Yu parade, the Corps participated in Seafair, marched in the Hoquiam Loggers' Playday Parade and won first place. The corps put on its first field show for the Kennedy-Blanchet football game last September 11th. During the winter, the corps raised money to complete equipment for its drum and horn lines, and gained support for its activities and financial support from the JFK Booster Club.

This spring and summer the corps has grown to over 50 members; it has grown in ability and experience and has accepted a more ambitious schedule: in addition to parades and demonstrations for local groups, the corps will participate in corps shows in the West, and will travel to Salt Lake City and Boise in August. To indicate its "step-up" into full corps activity and participation, the corps has adopted a new name and logo. From "mouchoirs" which reminds many of its beginnings as almost entirely a drum line, the corps has become the CONTINENTALS which indicates acceptance of a wider program and scope. The Corps director is Mr. Anton DeLateur, who is director of bands and musical activities at Kennedy High School.
