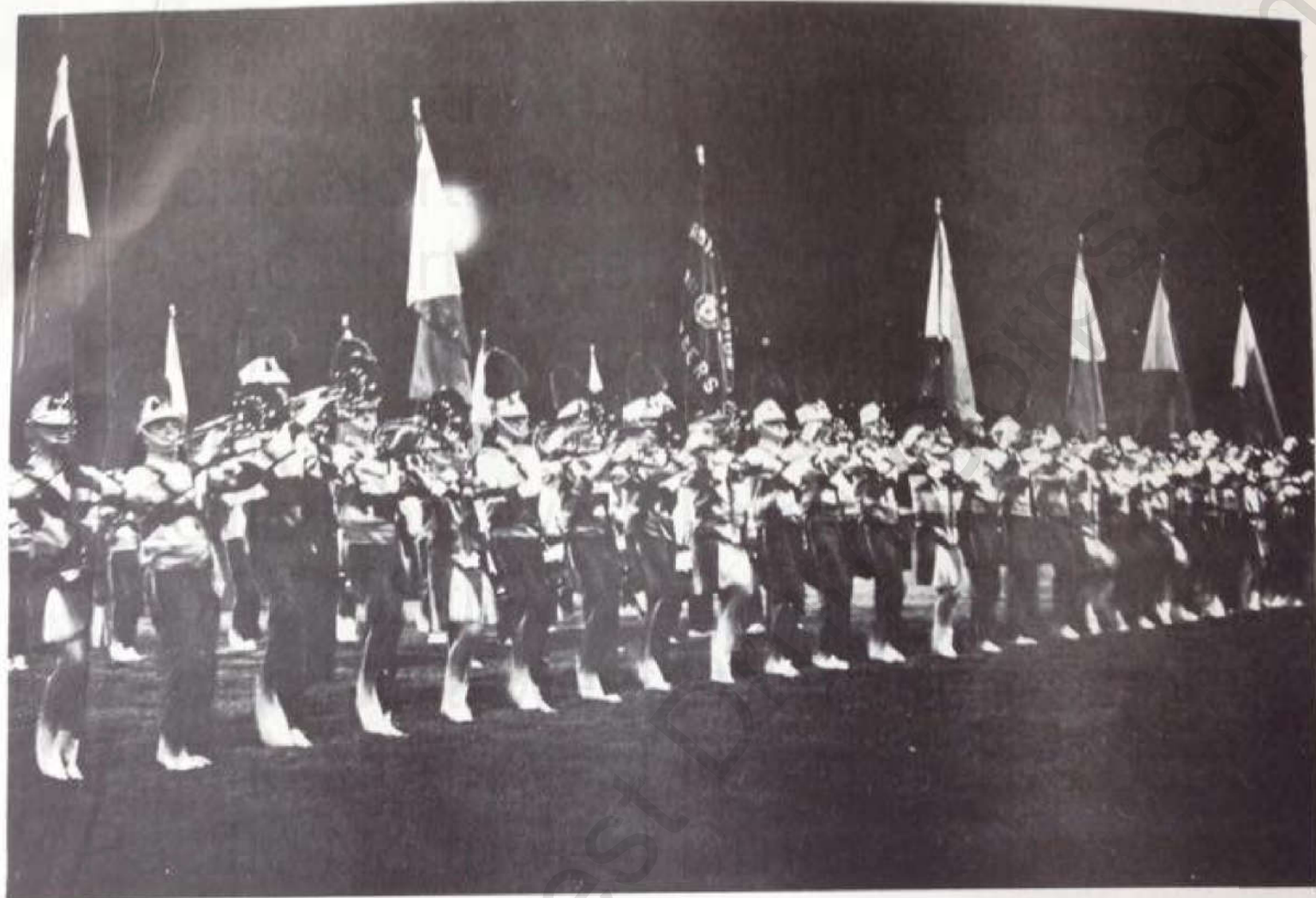
The SPARTANS are sponsored by the Vancouver Eagles, Elks, and Moose, as well as the Salmon Creek American Legion Post and District 6 VFW.

THE CASCADES DRUM & BUGLE CORPS

The Cascades Drum and Bugle Corps was organized in June, 1966, by Rod Stubbs and Jack Avery. Since that time, the corps has participated in parades and competitions throughout the Northwest. The 1969 and 1970 years were successful seasons in which the Cascades' parade record topped all the other corps in the area and resulted in their being named parade champions. The Color Guard was Northwest Champions for 1968 and 1969 and North Division Champions in 1970. The corps placed second in the American Legion State Competition in 1970 and third in the V.F.W. State contest. The Cascades were proud of winning first place honors in the P.N.E. parade in Vancouver, B.C. in 1968, 1969 and 1970. The corps traveled to Portland, Oregon to climax the summer season with the Color Guard placing fifth in the American Legion National Convention competition. The Corps members are looking forward to a bigger and better season in 1971.

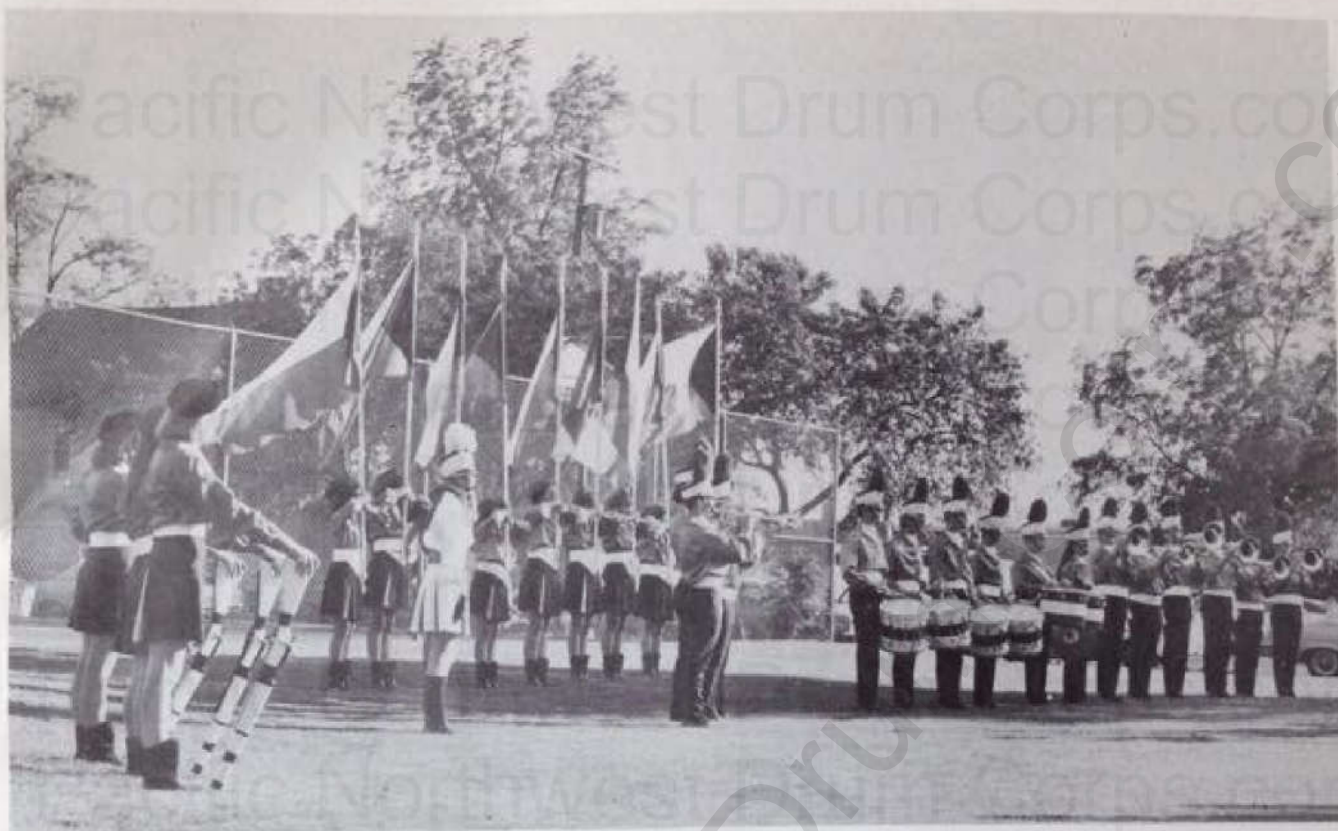

THE RANGERS DRUM & BUGLE CORPS

The "RANGERS" were organized in the Fall of 1963 by the late Lee Allen and a group of interested parents and citizens of the community. The members now include residents of most of the areas of Umatilla County and hence the change of name to "The RANGERS OF EASTERN OREGON" came about. These members probably travel more miles for rehearsals than any other corps in the Northwest.

The Rangers are an unsponsored corps. Their financing has been through candy sales, projects, dues, competition awards and donations, with transportation to Competitions supplied by their parents. It is hoped sometime and some way in the future to obtain a bus so their transportation could be as a unit.

During 1970, they participated in almost every Drum & Bugle Corps Competition in the Northwest Area, and at the American Legion Oregon State Competition at Coos Bay, the Rangers won more individual awards than any other corps.

The Rangers opened the 1971 season in Salem in January with new music and new drills and intend to make every show in the Northwest this year. At the American Legion Oregon State Competition, in Baker, in June, every Ranger that entered individual competition placed.

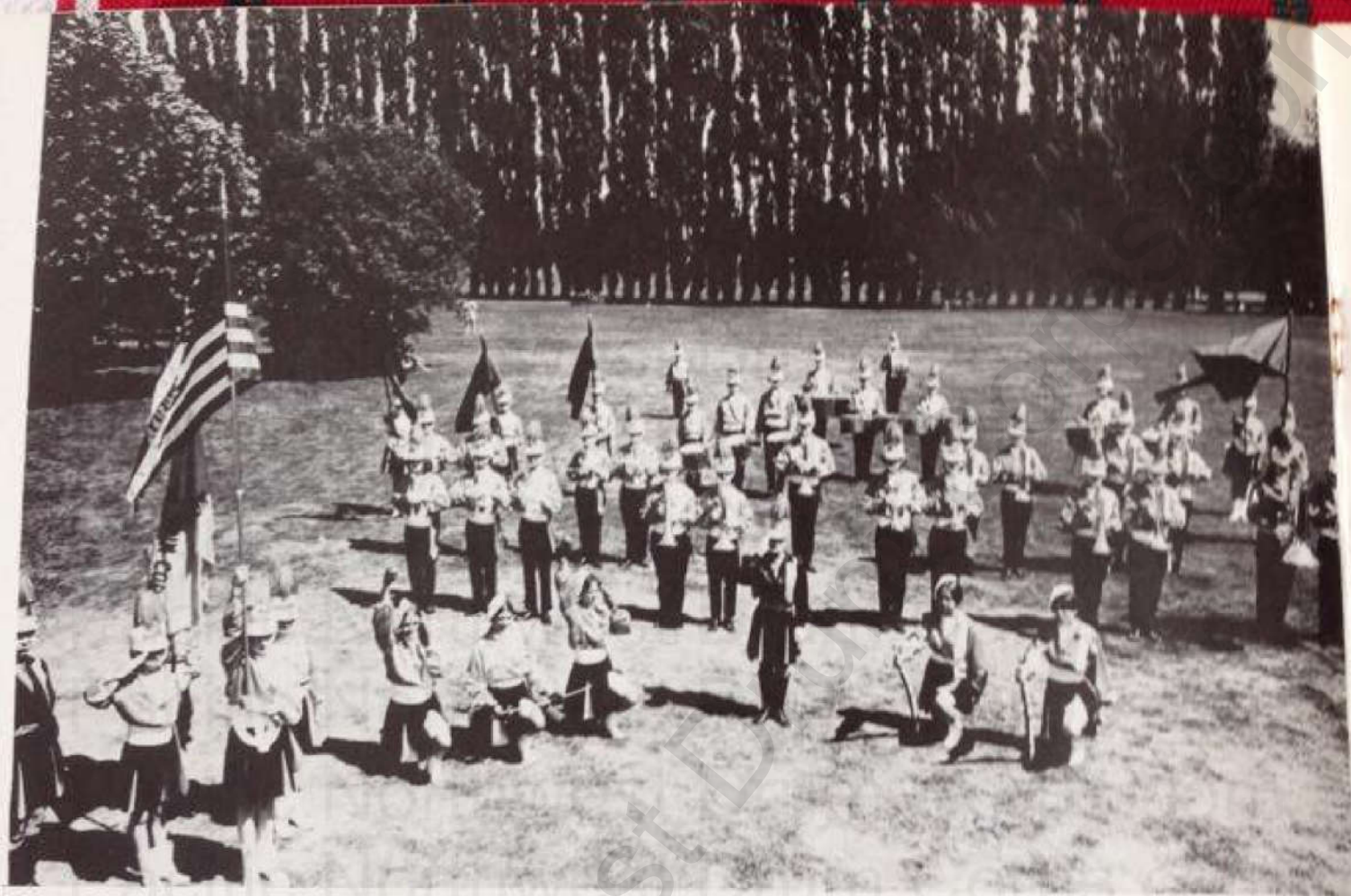
