## "Pass in Review" in the Pacific Northwest

The provocation of this article is the "Pass in Review" photo taken on July 5, 1969 at the "Sound Off '69" show at Madison High School in Portland, OR. This was the Hawks' (Portland, OR, below) home show and the same field used for the 1965 American Legion Nationals Prelims.

In the bottom photo, right to left: Shamrocks (Seattle, WA), Sentinels (Bellevue, WA), Royal Lancers (Portland, OR), Flamingos (Salem, OR), Imperial Cadets (Portland, OR), Cascade Cadets (Seattle, WA), Titans (Bremerton, WA, in white) and the Guardsmen (Bellevue, WA).

Not shown in the photo: the Hawks of Portland, OR, or the

Golden Skyliners of Great Falls, MT).

The Hawks were probably on the 50-yard line playing a cadence for the "Pass in Review."

Our recollection of the "Pass in Review" is that all corps lined up outside the stadium on the track, with each corps in single file formation, except for the host corps that was set up on the 50-yard-line.

The host corps would play a cadence and the rest of the corps would enter the stadium at the back of the field and march around the track one time (depending on the stadium).

As they approached their designated yard line after their lap, they'd peel-off into a parade formation on the field. The rest of the retreat ritual is the same as we all know and love.

Show results: Shamrocks, first place

A-Division; Cascade Cadets, first place B-Division; Golden Skyliners, first place C-Division.

The "Pass in Review" is military of origin where the troops in formation march by the commanding officers and dignitaries for their inspection and approval. Since drum corps is an outgrowth of the American Legion (to an extent), the Legion carried this practice over and applied it to drum corps. This is the same basic principle as marching by the reviewing stand in a parade, where the judges take the place of the commanding officer(s).

In the Pacific Northwest, "Pass in Review" was used sporadically in the 1960s. It was phased out completely by the early 1970s. Out of the hundreds of photos on our site, this is the only "Pass in Review" photo we have. It is a rarity. While "Pass in Review" was phased out, full retreats existed in the PNW until drum corps itself was almost snuffed

out of existence in the 1990s.







